Section 2: Community Description

Describe your community's history and what makes your community unique.

New Lenox was originally home to Native Americans. Oak trees, walnuts, and wildflowers filled the woods that surrounded Hickory Creek. The first settlers who came to the community in the late 1820s made their homes at Gougar Crossing, or what is now U.S. Route 30 and Gougar Road. Settlers came from the north and east, from the Kankakee River, the DesPlaines River and then on to Hickory Creek. The first name of the community was Van Horne Point. The community, later "laid out" by a survey, was named Tracy in honor of the General Superintendent of the Rock Island Railroad, which ran through the town. Mr. Tracy later requested the community be renamed after the Township, which was named New Lenox. This name came from Lenox, New York, home of John Van Duser who was the first supervisor of the Rock Island Railroad. The Township was established when Will County was created in 1852 with the building of the Rock Island railroad line between Chicago and Rock Island.

The Village of New Lenox was officially created after community leaders F. Carlton Cole, Walter Baers and others reasoned that the community should be incorporated and become a Village. They strongly felt the need for self-governance and local control that incorporation would bring. Recognizing the potential growth of the area, a community vote in the spring of 1946 resulted in the authorization for the creation of the Village of New Lenox. On October 4, 1946, the State of Illinois officially certified that the Village of New Lenox was legally organized and incorporated as a Village in the State of Illinois.

New Lenox is located in Will County, approximately 40 miles from downtown Chicago in the southwest corner of the six-county Chicago Metropolitan Area. According to the U.S Census Bureau's 2010 Census, the population of the Village of New Lenox is 24,394. However, according to our Assistant Village Administrator and Community Development Director, our population is approximately 26,332 as of October 31, 2015. This figure is derived from tracking the issuance of new building permits. Despite a downturn in the U.S. economy in 2008, New Lenox has been fortunate to experience an increase in residential growth, which is evidenced by the development of new subdivisions throughout the village.

According to a 2015 first quarter study by "MetroStudy," New Lenox is 8th in the entire Chicagoland market for new home starts. In addition, New Lenox is 2nd in Will County in this same category, behind Naperville, IL which is approximately six times larger. Although permits vary month-to-month, we have issued 138 permits for new homes from January 1st thru October 31st.

In addition to residential growth, New Lenox has seen an upswing in commercial development as well. Silver Cross Hospital, a state-of-the-art \$400,000,000 hospital, opened in early 2012. The hospital campus continues to expand and brings services from Children's Memorial Hospital, the Rehabilitation Institute of Chicago and the University of Chicago Medical Center. In addition to our magnificent hospital, "big box" stores such as Walmart and Target have opened along with a number of mid-size retail establishments. Residents and visitors have been enjoying new restaurants and many small businesses have recently opened in New Lenox, the "Home of Proud Americans."

Why is your community seeking a Safe Communities accreditation?

The New Lenox Safe Communities America Coalition held its first meeting on January 28, 2009. After 14 months of meetings, data collection, development of new injury prevention programs and completion of our application, we prepared for our site visit. Our site visit was held on April 26-27, 2010 and provided an opportunity to showcase many of our injury prevention initiatives. After a successful site visit, June 8, 2010 was selected for our "designation celebration" and serves as our official date for designation as a Safe Community.

Designation as a Safe Community was a huge achievement for our coalition because we were starting to see the results of our injury prevention initiatives starting to pay off. However, it would be several years before we would recognize the significance and positive impact that our designation would bring to our community. In 2014 the National Safety Council conducted a study which revealed that during the first two years following our designation, our residents saved approximately 14 million dollars in hospitalizations and related health care costs. Although our coalition knew it was doing good injury prevention work, the study really reinforced it.

The Village of New Lenox and its Safe Communities America Coalition believe that accreditation will *continue* to provide tremendous benefits for our community. These benefits will undoubtedly include a reduction in preventable injuries and deaths, which is always great news. However, we also recognize that this prestigious accolade brings other benefits to our community as well. As mentioned in the previous section, New Lenox continues to grow in both residential and commercial markets. As a prospective resident or developer looking for a new community to call home, why not choose a place that has made safety and injury prevention a priority? In addition, we have seen the Village of New Lenox earn a National Citizen Corps Council Achievement Award, four consecutive Governor's Hometown Awards and national recognition for programs that were developed as a result of the Safe Communities America initiative. It only makes sense to seek re-accreditation as a Safe Community due to the many benefits that this honor brings to our community.

Who in your community (person / agency) is taking the lead in organizing this effort? Why?

The New Lenox Police Department will serve as the lead agency for the New Lenox Safe Communities America Coalition and Daniel Martin will serve as the lead person for the Safe Communities America initiative. This structure has existed since January 2009 and has proven to be successful. As each year has gone by, our coalition leader has gained experience by attending annual conferences, participating in assessor training, learning through webinars, and leading our coalition's activities. As such, we believe that our coalition will continue to thrive under the current leadership structure.

2. Mission Statement

"Through a collaborative process, the New Lenox Safe Communities America Coalition will improve the health, safety and quality of life for residents and visitors through injury analysis and the implementation of programs designed to increase safety and prevent injuries."

3. Communications Strategy

The New Lenox Safe Communities America Coalition's communications strategy includes email, social media, local media outlets, Village of New Lenox web site, Nixle Community Alert Notification System, Safe Communities America conferences, Safe Communities America webinars and conference calls and additional communications opportunities. These strategies are utilized to communicate with coalition members as well as the public.

Email

One of the most common methods to communicate with coalition members is via email. A group distribution list has been established to communicate with all coalition members. Email is typically used to notify members of upcoming meetings, upcoming events, and to send information related to safety campaigns. Examples include, but are not limited to, National Falls Prevention Day, World Suicide Prevention Day, National Fire Prevention Week, Distracted Driving Awareness Month, and other safety campaigns endorsed by the National Safety Council. Email is also utilized to provide coalition members, with meeting agendas and minutes. In addition, a group distribution list has been established for each of our task groups. Information that is specific to a particular task group is sent directly to members, without overwhelming other coalition or task group members with email that is not applicable to their specific group.

Social Media

The New Lenox Safe Communities America Coalition created a Facebook page on October 2, 2013 for the purpose of communicating with stakeholders, the community, and other organizations that share an interest in injury prevention. The New Lenox Safe Communities America Facebook page has "Likes" from collaborative partner's Facebook pages and a concerted effort is made to "Like" their pages as well. In addition, our Facebook page "Likes" the Safe Communities America Facebook page, the National Safety Council's Facebook page, and other accredited Safe Communities Facebook pages. We enjoy passing along safety and injury prevention information from other pages and appreciate when others do the same. This has proven to be very effective when a Facebook page such as the "Village of New Lenox, Illinois," with over 2,500 "Likes" and a local audience, shares our information.

Local Media

The New Lenox Safe Communities America Coalition enjoys an excellent relationship with local media outlets who have been very receptive to covering our initiatives and events. In addition to coverage from the New Lenox Patch, the editor for the New Lenox Patriot was kind enough to allow space for a weekly column. The premise behind the column is to allow each of our task groups to write approximately 500 words related to their injury prevention efforts. This method has proven very effective in that it provides an opportunity to write about different injury prevention areas and allows the task groups an opportunity to promote upcoming events.

The New Lenox Village Hall is home to New Lenox Community Television (NLCTV), Channel 6. The NLCTV Director has been extraordinarily supportive when it comes to covering our events. Whether it's a severe weather spotter training at Lincoln-Way West High School, a seminar on concussions at the village hall, or an older adults falls prevention event at the Presence Healing Arts Pavilion, NLCTV does a great job. As everyone knows, folks are busy with work, school, and family activities. So when conflicts occur and people cannot attend our coalition's events, it's reassuring to know that they can be viewed on Channel 6, which also has a YouTube channel.

"The Villager" is a 4-page newsletter that is included in the January, April, July, and October water bills. The distribution for the quarterly newsletter is now over 8,500, most of which are residential dwellings. Approximately one or more coalition-related programs or events are featured in each of the newsletters, which is a great method to provide information to the residents.

Village of New Lenox Web Site

The New Lenox Safe Communities America Coalition has a presence on the Village of New Lenox web site. On the Safe Communities America page, there is a description of our coalition as well as a place to post meeting agendas. In addition, on the web site's home page, there is a section for all village-related meeting agendas and minutes, including those from the New Lenox Safe Communities America Coalition. This provides a nice opportunity to view current agendas and minutes as well as those that have been archived. Having an opportunity to post meeting agendas and minutes on the village page is great because it provides a link that can be shared to our Facebook page. We post the agendas on a regular basis and extend an invitation for citizens to attend our meetings. The link to the Village of New Lenox web site is <u>www.newlenox.net</u>.

Nixle Community Alert Notification System

The Village of New Lenox implemented a community alert notification system in March 2015. The system provides an opportunity for subscribers to receive text messages and email when events, significant or otherwise, occur within the village. There are three levels of alerts, which range from basic information regarding upcoming events to critical information related to public safety. The New Lenox Safe Communities America Coalition typically utilizes the email portion of the system to notify subscribers about upcoming events. For example, Nixle messages have been sent regarding severe weather spotter training, a workshop on youth sports concussions, a prescription drug abuse / addiction workshop, and an event pertaining to World Suicide Prevention Day.

Safe Communities America Annual Conferences

The New Lenox Safe Communities America Coalition has sent our coalition leader as well as other coalition members to six annual conferences. The annual conferences provide an excellent opportunity to learn about new programs and initiatives, while providing a forum to network with coalition members from across the country. Following each conference, our coalition leader passes along information from the conferences to coalition members, typically during September or October meetings. Additional information is sent via email for those that are unable to attend the meeting. The information that's typically passed along from the conference can be found in the meeting minutes, located in Appendix D.

Safe Communities America Webinars and Conference Calls

The New Lenox Safe Communities America Coalition leader participates in regular webinars and conference calls. In addition to participating, our coalition leader has also been called upon to be a presenter for several of the webinars and conference calls over the years. The webinars and conference calls have included information about new injury prevention strategies, program evaluation, annual report requirements, and accreditation requirements. Much like the annual conferences, relevant information from the webinars and conference calls is passed along to coalition members at meetings or via email.

Additional Communications Opportunities

On several occasions we've been able to take advantage of opportunities to communicate outside of our coalition, including outside of our Safe Communities Network. For example, our coalition leader has completed the Safe Community assessor training, which includes the opportunity to review applications and conduct site visits. One example includes the review of Santa Rosa County Florida's application and subsequent site visit. During the review process, excellent lines of communication were established with their coalition leader and other key coalition members. This communication continued throughout the site visit and exists today as Safe Community colleagues. It's interesting to discover that although 1,200 miles may separate communities, the injuries and methods to prevent them are remarkably the same. Much can be learned from this type of communication and collaboration.

Another great opportunity to communicate outside of our coalition and network occurred on March 6, 2014. The New Lenox Safe Communities America Coalition had the honor or hosting two visitors from Osaka Japan. Yoko Shiraishi, Chair, Japan Institution for Safe Communities and Hisato Imai, Director, Japan Institution for Safe Communities traveled to the United States to meet with staff from the National Safety Council. As part of the study visit, Shiraishi and Imai requested to visit a designated "Safe Community" and New Lenox was chosen as one of two locations for the visit. New Lenox was honored to play host and learned as much from our visitors as they did from us. In this instance, we found that thousands of miles may separate communities, and there may be differences in languages and cultures. However, similar to our friends in Santa Rosa County Florida, our interests in the development of strategies to reduce injuries and prevent deaths are very similar. Following the visit, both Shiraishi and Imai "Liked" our Facebook page and remain active visitor to our page to this day.

Yet another great opportunity to communicate outside of our coalition occurred on July 16, 2014 when our coalition leader was asked to speak at the Green River Area Development District (GRADD) Citizen Corps Council Meeting in Owensboro, Kentucky. The GRADD folks were extremely interested in Safe Community accreditation thanks information provided by Genia McKee at the Kentucky Injury Prevention and Research Center. Due to their interest, they wanted to hear from a representative from an accredited Safe Community and Genia reached out to our coalition leader for assistance. This provided an excellent opportunity to talk about the Safe Communities initiative as well as what we were doing on a local level. One GRADD's strengths is in the area of emergency preparedness. As such, the invitation provided a great opportunity to speak about our Community Emergency Response Team (CERT). Those in attendance were provided with a copy of our quarterly newsletter, another great method to communicate our efforts.

II. Data Collection and Application

What does your local data tell you about injuries and safety and how is the coalition applying the data to set goals? Include the most recent data available.

1. Community Demographics

According to the 2010 United States Census, the population for the Village of New Lenox is 24,394. However, according to our Assistant Village Administrator and Community Development Director, our population is approximately 26,332 as of October 31, 2015. This figure is derived from tracking the issuance of new building permits.

According to the 2010 United States Census, New Lenox is 50.7% female and 49.3% male.

According to the 2010 United States Census, 6.7% of persons are under 5 years of age, 30.8% are under 18 years of age, and 8.2% are 65 years of age or older.

According to the 2010 United States Census, 96.0% of the population is white (not Hispanic or Latino), 0.7% are black or African American, 0.2% are American Indian and Alaska Native, 0.8% are Asian, 0.0% are Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, 1.1% are two or more races, and 5.7% are Hispanic or Latino.

According to the 2010 United States Census, 96.7% of residents are high school graduates (percent of persons age 25+) and 35.5% of residents have Bachelor's degrees or higher (percent of persons age 25+).

According to the U.S. Census Bureau's American FactFinder (source: U.S. Census Bureau, 2010-2012 American Community Survey), the total school enrollment in the Village of New Lenox was 7,700 in 2010-2012. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was 800 and elementary or high school enrollment was 5,000 children. College or graduate school enrollment was 1,800.

According to the U.S. Census Bureau's American FactFinder (source: U.S. Census Bureau, 2009-2013 5-year American Community Survey), in 2013, income for the previous 12 months was below poverty level for 472 residents (163 male, 309 female). For reference, 2012 was 357 (112 male, 245), 2011 was 385 (139 male, 246 female) and 2010 was 382 (152 male, 230 female).

According to the United States Census Bureau's American FactFinder, (source: U.S. Census Bureau, 2009-2013 5-year American Community Survey), the 2013 unemployment rate for New Lenox was 5.9%. The unemployment rate is calculated for persons 16 years of age and over. For reference, 2012 was 5.3%, 2011 was 5.6%, 2010 was 5.9% and 2009 was 5.4%.

2. Injury Data

Motor Vehicle Crashes

Information regarding motor vehicle crashes, including fatal crashes, was obtained from the New Lenox Police Department's Records Division and Traffic Unit.

In 2015 (January 1st thru October 15th), the New Lenox Police Department handled 587 motor vehicle crashes. The top three causation factors were Failure to Reduce Speed to Avoid a Crash (143), Failure to Yield the Right-of-Way (66), and Improper Backing (61).

In 2014, the New Lenox Police Department handled 743 motor vehicle crashes. The top three causation factors were Failure to Reduce Speed to Avoid a Crash (155), Failure to Yield the Right-of-Way (112), and Improper Backing (85).

In 2013, the New Lenox Police Department handled 680 motor vehicle crashes. The top three causation factors were Failure to Reduce Speed to Avoid a Crash (100), Improper Backing (83), and Failure to Yield the Right-of-Way (78).

In 2012, the New Lenox Police Department handled 662 motor vehicle crashes. The top three causation factors were Failure to Reduce Speed to Avoid a Crash (115), Failure to Yield the Right-of-Way (92), and Improper Backing (80).

In 2011, the New Lenox Police Department handled 671 motor vehicle crashes. The top three causation factors were Failure to Reduce Speed to Avoid a Crash (149), Improper Backing (91), and Failure to Yield the Right-of-Way (90).

The data suggests that the New Lenox Police Department investigates between 662 and 743 motor vehicles each year.* Failure to Reduce Speed to Avoid a Crash was consistently the leading cause of crashes while Failure to Yield the Right-of-Way and Improper Backing were either second or third. Although not referenced above, "Unable to Determine" consistently came in fourth each year.

With regard to <u>full</u> year's data (2011, 2012, 2013, and 2014) the average annual number of crashes is 689. There was a -1.34% decrease from 2011 to 2012, a 2.72% increase from 2012 to 2013 and a 9.26% increase from 2013 to 2014. Statistically, 2015 will *likely* end lower than 2014, but higher than the annual average.

Fatal Traffic Crashes

The New Lenox Police Department did not experience any fatal crashes in 2011, 2012, 2013, and 2014. However, there was one fatal crash on February 13, 2015 involving a 17-year pedestrian (high school student) that was struck by a semi-truck while crossing U.S. Route 30 near Schoolhouse Road. The crash occurred mid-morning when the student was returning to Lincoln-Way Central High School. After a thorough investigation it was determined that the student was at fault as he apparently fell while crossing the roadway.

In addition to the above data from the New Lenox Police Department, Silver Cross Hospital provided the following data regarding Emergency Department visits, resulting from motor vehicle crashes:

With regard to <u>full</u> year's data (2011, 2012, 2013, and 2014) the average annual number of personal injury crashes is 40. There was a 58.33% increase from 2011 to 2012, a -43.86% decrease from 2012 to 2013 and a 9.38% increase from 2013 to 2014. Statistically, 2015 will *likely* end higher than 2014, and higher than the annual average. It appears that motorcycle crashes have dropped from a high of 8 in 2012 to just one in 2015.

It should be noted that data from Silver Cross Hospital is for the zip code 60451 (New Lenox Township), and not just the Village of New Lenox.

In addition to motor vehicle crash data from the New Lenox Police Department and Silver Cross Hospital, the New Lenox Fire Protection District provided crash data as well.

Falls / Older Adults

According to Silver Cross Hospital, the following fall-related injuries came into the Emergency Department:

 - 3 thrown from a horse
 - 6 from other source-wheelchair, playground equipment, etc...
- 2012 Total 69 57 falls or 82.60% were 60 years of age or older
 - 6 down flight of stairs
 - 1 from a commode
 - 2 from a ladder
 - 1 from a chair
 - 58 from standing position
 - 1 from a horse
- 2011 Total 103 72 falls or 69.90% were 60 years of age or older
 - 14 from a 2nd story
 - 3 from a ladder
 - 1 from a horse
 - 66 from a standing position
 - 19 from other source-wheelchair, playground equipment, toilet, etc...

With regard to <u>full</u> year's data (2011, 2012, 2013, and 2014), the annual average number of total falls is 76.75. The annual average number for older adults (60 years of age or older) is 57.75. With regard to older adult falls, there was a -20.83% decrease from 2011 to 2012, a -24.56 decrease from 2012 to 2013 and a 37.21 increase from 2013 to 2014. Statistically, 2015 will *likely* end lower than 2014 and lower than the annual average.

It should be noted that data from Silver Cross Hospital is for the zip code 60451 (New Lenox Township), and not just the Village of New Lenox.

According to the New Lenox Fire Protection District, paramedics responded to the following fall-related injuries:

- 2015* Total 227 180 or 79.30% were 60 years of age or older 58 of the seniors were male while 122 were female
- 2014 Total 195 127 or 65.13% were 60 years of age or older 31 of the seniors were male while 96 were female
- 2013 Total 51 30 or 58.82% were 60 years of age or older 8 of the seniors were male while 22 were female
- 2012 Total 102 65 or 63.73% were 60 years of age or older 18 of the seniors were male while 47 were female
- 2011^{**} Total 44 24 or 54.54% were 60 years of age or older 6 of the seniors were male while 18 were female

With regard to <u>full</u> year's data (2012, 2013, and 2014) the annual average of total falls is 116. The annual average number for older adults (60 years of age or older) is 74. With regard to older adult falls, there was a -53.85% decrease from 2012 to 2013 and a 323.33% increase from 2013 to 2014. Statistically, 2015 will *likely* end higher than 2014 and higher than the annual average.

It should be noted that data from the New Lenox Fire Protection District is for the zip code 60451 (New Lenox Township), and not just the Village of New Lenox. In addition, data for 2014 and 2015 was derived from a different records management system than 2011, 2012, and 2013 data.

Poisoning by Prescription Drug Overdose

The New Lenox Fire Protection District was unable to provide data for this category. As a result of our data request, they have made changes in their reporting software that will capture this data moving forward.

According to New Lenox Police Department reports, there were 70 drug overdoses (including deaths) between 2011 and 2015. With the understanding that 2015 has not yet come to a close, that's an average of 14 drug overdoses each year. Forty-six (65.71%) of the victims were male while 24 (34.28%) of the victims were female. The average age of all victims was 27. The average age of the male victims was 26 while the average age of the female victims was 28. Thirty-eight (54.28%) of the cases involved heroin, 25 (35.71%) of the cases involved prescription medications and 7 (10%) of the cases were "other" (alcohol, acid, cannabis, or unknown).

It should be noted that individuals ingesting drugs with the intent of harming themselves were counted in the completed or attempted suicide category.

It should also be noted that Silver Cross Hospital is in the Village of New Lenox and the New Lenox Police Department's jurisdiction. As such, police officers were called to the Emergency Department to handle drug overdose cases, and in at least one instance a drug overdose death. These cases include individuals that are nonresidents who ingested drugs outside of our jurisdiction, but were transported to Silver Cross Hospital for treatment.

The following data is from the Will County Coroner's Office and includes information regarding accidental overdose <u>deaths</u>:

According to the Will County Coroner's Office, there were 15 drug overdose deaths in the Village of New Lenox between 2011 and 2015. That's an average of three deaths annually. Thirteen (86.66%) of the victims were male while two (13.33%) were female. The average age of all victims was 31. The average age of the male victims was 32 while the average age of the female victims was 23.5. It appears that all of the deaths involve heroin or an opioid-based drug.

The data suggests that New Lenox experiences 2.4 completed suicides annually.* Nine out of twelve, or 75% of the victims were male. Six out of twelve, or 50% utilized a firearm to complete suicide. The average age of the male victims was 47.4, while the average age of the female victims was 44.3.

The incident on 02/19/2012 involving the 86-year old male occurred in New Lenox. The victim was alive at the scene, transported to Silver Cross Hospital, and then airlifted to Loyola Medical Center in Maywood, IL. The victim died on 02/20/2012 and therefore the death became a Cook County Medical Examiner's case. Since the act occurred in New Lenox, it has been classified as a completed suicide.

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It should be noted that the vast majority (almost all) of victims were transported to Silver Cross Hospital for a psychological evaluation. This includes by-way-of voluntary and involuntary admission. A much smaller number of individuals were transported to what is now <u>Presence</u> St. Joseph Medical Center.

Interestingly, some of the cases included repeat victim(s). For example, one victim attempted suicide on seven separate occasions.

Many of the incidents include individuals who had previously been diagnosed with behavioral health issues. A good portion of other cases involved the victim being under the influence of drugs and / or alcohol.

From January 1, 2011 thru October 20, 2015, there were a total of 153 attempted suicides. Ninety-four (61.44%) of the attempted suicides were by males, while 59 (38.56%) were by females. The average age of <u>all</u> victims was 32.65. The average age of males was 33.24, while the average age for female attempted suicides was 31.71.

Domestic Violence

According to New Lenox Police Department, the below data represents the total number of Domestic Violence cases from 2011 thru 2015.* For clarification, these are Uniform Crime Report numbers, which are classified as "Domestic Battery." An arrest was made in almost all cases.

With regard to <u>full</u> year's data (2011, 2012, 2013, and 2014) the annual average number of domestic violence cases was 32.75. There was a -39.47% decrease from 2011 to 2012, an 86.96% increase from 2012 to 2013 and a -37.21% decrease from 2013 to 2014. Statistically, 2015 will *likely* end lower than 2014 and lower than the annual average.

Total numbers for all violent crime offenses:

Using the above definition for "violent crime" and based on full year's data (2011, 2012, 2013, and 2014), the New Lenox Police Department investigates an average of 106 violent crimes annually. There was a -0.94% decrease from 2011 to 2012, an 18.09% increase from 2012 to 2013 and a -28.23% decrease from 2013 to 2014. Statistically, 2015 will *likely* end higher than 2014, but lower than the annual average.

*Data for 2015 is thru September 30th.

Workplace Injuries

In June of 2014 our Workplace Safety Task Group, in partnership with the New Lenox Chamber of Commerce, developed a survey for (Chamber of Commerce) businesses. The survey asked questions to identify type of industry, number of employees, hours of operation, injuries within previous 12 months, and what types of injuries. In addition, the survey asked if the business has a "Safety Committee," a "Safety Manager," a "Workplace Safety Emergency Plan," and if they provide new employees with a safety orientation.

Twenty-three businesses responded to the survey from retail, service, health care, construction and "other" sectors. "Other" ranged from non-profits to local government.

Twelve businesses (52.17%) answered that they employ 1-10 employees, one (4.35%) answered that they employ 11-25 employees, one (4.35%) answered that they employee 26-50 employees, two (8.70%) answered that they employee 51-100 employees, five (21.74%) answered that they employ 101-250 employees, and two (8.70%) answered that they employ 250+ employees.

43.48% of the businesses operate 8-hours per day, 17.39% operate 16-hours per day, 17.39% operate 24-hours per day, and 21.74% operate 10, 12, or 15-hours per day.

39.13% of the businesses answered "yes" when asked if any injuries occurred within the last 12 months, while 60.87% answered "no."

With regard to type of injuries occurred in their workplace, 7 (30.43%) reported falls, 2 (8.70%) reported burns, 6 (26.09%) reported cuts or lacerations requiring sutures, 1 (4.35%) reported an eye injury, 1 (4.35%) reported a broken bone, and 15 (65.22%) reported "other" injuries. "Other" included needle sticks and / or exposure to bodily fluids, "strength stress," rotator cuff, and under "other" 12 reported no injury occurred.

Thirteen (56.12%) businesses reported that they do have a "Safety Committee" or similar group with efforts toward injury prevention. Ten (433.48%) reported that they do not have any such entity.

Seven (30.43%) businesses reported that they do have a "Safety Manager" or someone responsible for injury prevention. Sixteen (69.57%) reported that no such position exists within their organization.

Fifteen (65.22%) businesses reported that they do have a "Workplace Safety Emergency Plan" or similar document. Eight (34.78%) reported that they do not have a plan.

Fifteen (65.22%) businesses reported that they do provide new hires with a safety orientation. Eight (34.78%) do not provide their employees with a safety orientation.

Unfortunately not much could be gleaned from the survey results due to the small sample size. The intent of the survey was to identify key injury areas and other deficiencies such as the absence of a "Workplace Safety Emergency Plan." Our Workplace Safety Task Group was prepared to identify individuals trained in occupational safety that would provide training to interested businesses. In addition, our task group was prepared to develop a "model" "Workplace Safety Emergency Plan" that businesses could adopt and modify accordingly. Our task group suspected that smaller businesses, without dedicated safety personnel, would be interested in these offerings. With this said, in the midst of the work, the Task Group Chair stepped down and the efforts did not move forward. Our Workplace Safety Task Group has been in limbo ever since, but we hope that in the near future it will be revived with new leadership and members.

Aside from the above survey, our coalition has struggled to obtain solid data on workplace injuries. Although the New Lenox Fire Protection District has been extremely helpful with providing injury data, their protocol for reporting injuries in the workplace does not distinguish between worker and visitor injuries. In addition, their records management system identifies "runs by location type." The most applicable category is "business / commercial," but again it does not distinguish whether an employee or visitor was injured.

In 2015 (January 1st thru November 14th) the New Lenox Fire Protection District Paramedics responded to 43 injuries which have been classified as work-related.

One can assume that "cut hand," "laceration," and "nail in foot," were injuries affecting employees. Other injuries such as "chest pain," "weakness," and "fall victim" are not so obvious. In 2014, paramedics responded to 32 work-related injuries that were just as ambiguous. As mentioned in the previous paragraph, there's no way of telling if the injury was sustained by an employee or visitor.

Despite these obstacles, our coalition has recently received some good news regarding workplace injury data collection. Linda Forst, MD, MPD, from the University of Illinois at Chicago, has graciously offered to work with our coalition in this area. Linda drafted a proposal for the collaborative project, and attended our November 18, 2015 meeting. Although Linda's abstract is still in DRAFT form, her intentions to assist our coalition are as follows:

- Conduct surveillance of injuries and illnesses, both general and occupational, among New Lenox residents and surrounding communities; develop an ongoing health/injury surveillance system for the area.
- Conduct an inventory of employers in the Village of New Lenox and surrounding areas regarding health promotion needs and services.
- Assemble a health promotion curriculum based on the findings from the needs assessment (ie, select a topic/issue or multiple issues like nutrition, blood pressure control, cancer screening, physical activity; select a modality depending on site, circumstances, etc.).
- Adapt a protocol and conduct health promotion in selected workplaces
- Assemble health protection materials adapted from the OSHA 10-hour courses on health and safety for both general industry and construction
- Identify, recruit, and train community health workers from among CBOs to deliver health protection training in the field.
- Evaluate all three efforts: surveillance, health promotion, and health and safety training.
- Plan a longitudinal, multi-site study of all these activities (surveillance, health promotion, health protection).

We are very much looking forward to working with Dr. Forst and her staff to identify workplace injuries (inside and outside of our community) and taking to steps to prevent injuries moving forward.

Emergency Preparedness

The Village of New Lenox has not incurred any injuries in this area since our last application for accreditation. That said, our community leaders and coalition stakeholders recognize that it's not a question of "if" a disaster will happen, but "when?" As such, New Lenox has become a leader in emergency preparedness since we formed the New Lenox Safe Communities America Coalition in January 2009.

Many of our successes in the area of emergency preparedness have occurred as a result of our Community Emergency Response Team (CERT). New Lenox CERT is a coalition-led program that operates through the New Lenox Police Department. To date, over 300 residents have completed the 20-Hour Basic CERT Class and our team members have been instrumental in a number of awards that have been bestowed upon the Village of New Lenox.

As a result of the outstanding efforts of our CERT volunteers, the New Lenox Citizen Corps Council was awarded a National Citizen Corps Council Achievement Award in 2010 for its work in community preparedness. CERT volunteers also contributed to our community's designation by the National Weather Service as a Storm Ready Community. The first designation was in 2010, followed by re-designation in 2013, which expires in 2016.

CERT volunteers also played an integral role in the Village of New Lenox winning four consecutive Governor's Home Town Awards (2011, 2012, 2013, 2014), administered through the State of Illinois and its Department of Economic Opportunity. Although CERT members played a role in all four awards, the 2011 and 2014 awards were specifically for "Preparing Citizens for Emergencies and Disasters."

In addition, the New Lenox CERT has participated in the Illinois Emergency Management Agency's Prairie State CERT Challenge (PSCC) six times since its inception in 2010. Each year New Lenox sends a team to the PSCC, which tests Illinois CERTs and their ability to respond to emergencies and disasters. Challenges at the event include triage, treatment, search & rescue, transport, team building, disaster psychology, terrorism, and fire safety / hazards. Ten to twelve teams typically participate each year and New Lenox has won the event twice (2011 and 2015). Aside from taking 1st place twice, New Lenox has placed either 2nd or 3rd the other four years and has earned the well-deserved reputation as being one of the best teams in the State of Illinois.

Aside from the wonderful accolades that our CERT members bring to the Village of New Lenox, they give approximately 5,000 hours of their time each year. These hours come in the form of training, community events and "activations," including requests for mutual aid. Examples of training include those disciplines tested at the Prairie State CERT Challenge as well as incident command, documentation, severe weather spotter, passenger train emergency preparedness, pipeline safety, shelter operations, winter weather preparedness, communications, functional needs, and tabletop exercises. Examples of community events include assistance at National Night Out, races (5K, 10K, Chicago Marathon, Shamrock Shuffle), Triple Play Concerts, Relay for Life, St. Baldrick's, New Lenox Township Clean-Up Day, ShareFest, blood drives, French Market, Special Needs Day, Loyalty Day Parade, Christmas in the Commons, food drives, health & safety expos, and emergency preparedness presentations for community groups. Examples of "activations" or mutual aid assistance include volunteering at warming & cooling centers, American Red Cross Shelters, and helping Emergency Management Agencies in Will, Cook and LaSalle County severe weather events that resulted in flooding.

In addition, New Lenox CERT volunteers assisted the communities of Coal City and Diamond, IL in November 2013 following a devastating tornado. Our volunteers organized a collection for the tornado victims, which resulted in approximately \$50,000 in donations (supplies, gift cards and cash). Volunteers drove the donations to Coal City in vans and box trucks, while many remained there to help sort the items. Ironically, our CERT members assisted the residents of Coal City once again on June 26, 2015 following another tornado that impacted their community. Our volunteers assisted with clean-up operations and based on their experience, they served as supervisors of spontaneous volunteers who also arrived to assist. New Lenox CERT members gave approximately 300 hours of their time between these two events.

Additional information about the New Lenox Community Emergency Response Team, including quarterly newsletters, can be found at the Village of New Lenox web site <u>www.newlenox.net</u>. CERT is under "departments," then "police." In addition, New Lenox CERT has a Facebook page, which can be accessed at <u>https://www.facebook.com/NewLenoxCERT</u>.

Again, in terms of injuries there's not much to report – thankfully! We will continue to strengthen our emergency preparedness efforts through our CERT program, Search and Rescue Team and other initiatives that our stakeholders have in place.

Additional data regarding motor vehicle crashes was obtained from the New Lenox Fire Protection District.

Data regarding fall-related injuries was obtained from the Trauma Program Coordinator for Silver Cross Hospital and represents Emergency Department visits as a result of falls. Additional data regarding fall-related injuries was obtained from the New Lenox Fire Protection District. 2015 and 2014 data was generated by "Image Trend." 2013, 2012, and 2011 data was generated by their previous system.

Data regarding poisoning (prescription and other drugs) was obtained from New Lenox Police Department reports.

Additional data regarding poisoning (prescription and other drugs) deaths, was obtained from the Will County Coroner's Office.

Data regarding <u>completed</u> suicides was obtained from Will County Coroner's Office and New Lenox Police Department reports.

Data regarding <u>attempted</u> suicides was obtained from New Lenox Police Department reports.

Data regarding domestic violence cases was obtained from New Lenox Police Department reports.

Data regarding violent crime (Homicide, Criminal Sexual Assault, Robbery, Aggravated Assault / Battery, Simple Assault / Battery, Deadly Weapons, and Other Sex Offenses) was obtained from New Lenox Police Department reports.

Data regarding workplace injuries was obtained from a New Lenox Safe Communities America Coalition survey.

Additional data regarding workplace injuries was obtained from the New Lenox Fire Protection District.

There was no injury data available for natural disasters from 2011-2015.

5. Project Goals

Older Adult Falls / Matter of Balance

Reduce the number of falls in the older adult population (60+).

*Schedule four Matter of Balance classes annually, which will train 48 seniors.

Older Adult Falls / Fit and Strong

Reduce the number of falls in the older adult population (60+).

*Schedule two Fit and Strong classes annually, which will train 50 seniors.

Violence and Suicide Prevention / Question, Persuade and Refer (QPR) Reduce the number of completed and attempted suicides in our community. *Schedule four QPR classes annually, which will train 100 citizens.

Violence and Suicide Prevention / Mental Health First Aid

Reduce the number of completed and attempted suicides in the community.

*Schedule two Mental Health First Aid classes annually, which will train 70 citizens.

Poisoning by Prescription Drug Overdose / Unwanted Medication Disposal Program

Provide a safe method for disposal of unwanted medications to prevent abuse among teens and misuse by older adults.

*Increase annual collection totals by 10% each year.

Emergency Preparedness / Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Reduce injuries and deaths resulting from natural, technological, and intentional disasters.

*Schedule two 20-Hour Basic CERT classes annually, which will train 70 citizens.

6. How will the data be used in the development of new strategies?

Injury data, in part, has driven our coalition's initiatives since we began our efforts in January, 2009. That said, we've recognized that data is often times difficult to collect and may not tell us everything that we would like it to. Although there are many examples, one that comes to mind is in the area of "Poisoning by Prescription" Drug Overdose." We've learned through studies that prescription drug overdose deaths are on the rise across the country. This is especially true when it comes to opioid-based prescription drugs, which are thankfully under close scrutiny. So while examining the data for this application, we learned from the Will County Coroner's Office that we've had 15 drug overdose deaths since 2011. All of the deaths have involved heroin. What we don't know is when, and why, the victim started using heroin. Was it because they started using opioid-based prescription drugs and then switched to heroin when their supply ran out? Unfortunately at a local level we don't have these answers because our police officers and paramedics are busy people. Often times it's all they can do to respond to a call, take the appropriate course of action, clear the call, and move onto the next one. In a perfect world someone (police officer, paramedic, drug addiction specialist) would conduct interviews with family members for the purpose of getting to the bottom of the victim's drug addiction. By the same token, it would be nice to interview heroin overdose survivors, but that's easier said than done. Depending on one's perspective, individuals addicted to heroin may be considered "victims," but they're also engaged in criminal behavior. As such, they're likely to be extremely hesitant to reveal details about their addiction, especially to a police officer. Despite these challenges we will continue to seek innovative ways to make the best use of data, in this area as well as other key areas.

Motor Vehicle Crashes

We will continue to utilize crash data to drive our strategies in this category. That said, shortcomings were recognized in our data collection for this application. For example, the New Lenox Fire Protection District switched to a new records management system in 2014. As such, we were cautioned about potential differences in numbers (2011, 2012, 2013 vs. 2014 and 2015). In addition, there were shortcomings in obtaining crash data from New Lenox Police Department reports. For example, there was no way of telling a personal injury crash from a property damage only crash without pulling and reading each report. So for a year like 2014 where there were 743 crashes that becomes a monumental task. Moving forward, the New Lenox Police Department will be migrating to a new records management system in January 2016, so we'll have to see what types of data it will be able to produce in this category. Lastly, we strongly believe that distracted driving (texting, cell phone use) is an issue in our community and is causing crashes. However, our data does not support this assumption. The unfortunate reality is that following a crash, drivers are reluctant to admit that they were on their cell phone at the time of the crash. Without an admission or any additional evidence, it's difficult to issue a citation for "Unlawful Use of an Electronic Device." This is likely the reason for "Failure to Reduce Speed to Avoid a Crash" being the number one crash causation factor from 2011-2015.

Falls / Older Adults

We will continue to utilize New Lenox Fire Protection District and Silver Cross Hospital data to drive our strategies in this category. It's very helpful to know how many fall-related injuries come into the Emergency Department at Silver Cross Hospital and how many ambulance runs involve fall-related injuries. After studying these injuries since January 2009, it wasn't a surprise to see that the vast majority of fall-related injuries involve seniors.

In terms of this application, we were pleased to see that based on Silver Cross Hospital data we've made some real strides. However, the New Lenox Fire Protection District data suggests that older adult fall-related injuries are definitely on the rise. Unfortunately we do not have an explanation for the numbers. Does it mean that the injuries are less severe and seniors are not going to the Emergency Department at Silver Cross Hospital? Along the same lines, are paramedics being called more often? Are the fall-related injuries less severe and the seniors are signing refusals for transport to the hospital? Unfortunately the records management software does not provide answers to these questions and in speaking with New Lenox Fire Protection District personnel, it's doubtful that reading individual reports would provide answers either.

In addition, we will also be seeking additional sources of data in this area. We've had a number of "physician's immediate care" facilities open in New Lenox in the past several years. We suspect that seniors are visiting these types of facilities when they sustain an injury that does not rise to the level of calling the paramedics or driving to the emergency room. As such, these facilities could provide additional data and perhaps become good candidates to partner with our coalition by promoting our evidence-based older adults falls prevention programs.

Poisoning by Prescription Drug Overdose

We will continue to utilize New Lenox Police Department and Will County Coroner's Office reports and data to drive our strategies in this area. The data tells us that in terms of drug overdoses (survivors), we need to focus our efforts primarily on males (65% of the victims), but can't overlook females (35%) either. The data tells us that the average age of the victims is 27 (males 26, females 28), but there were overdose victims as young as 15 and old as 56, which we need to be mindful of as well.

In terms of drug overdose deaths, 13 (86.66%) out of 15 victims were male. The average age of the male victims was 32, while the two female victim's average age was 23.5.

As noted in the introduction to this section, the data tells us that heroin is a real problem in our community, but why? Where are things going sideways for those that become addicted to heroin? These are the questions that we need to find the answers to so we can develop strategies to address the problem at an earlier stage. In addition to New Lenox Police Department and Will County Coroner's Office reports, we will also seek additional sources of data as well. Perhaps data from our friends in the private sector in the form of substance abuse and addiction facilities will be helpful.

Violence and Suicide

We will continue to utilize New Lenox Police Department and Will County Coroner's Office reports data to drive our strategies in this area. In terms of <u>completed</u> suicides, the Will County Coroner's Office data was very helpful and was confirmed by New Lenox Police Department reports. However, <u>attempted</u> suicides are not tracked by the Will County Coroner's Office, so our data collection relied upon New Lenox Police Department reports.

Based on our data collection, we experience about 2.4 <u>completed</u> suicides annually. The vast majority, nine out of twelve, or 75% between 2001 and 2015, were males. Fifty percent of the victims utilized a firearm to complete suicide. Male and female victims were relatively close in age in terms of averages (47.4 for males, 44.3 for females).

While <u>completed</u> suicides were found to be 2.4 annually, we experience over 12 times (30.6) as many <u>attempted</u> suicides annually. Of the total of 153 <u>attempted</u> suicides, 94 (61.44%) were males, while 59 (38.56%) were females. Much like with the drug overdose cases, it's very difficult for the police officers to get to the root cause of why the victims wished to take their own lives. The good news is that almost all of the victims were transported to Silver Cross Hospital for a psychological evaluation. It was also interesting to note how closely this category ties into prescription medications and how the victims often times utilized prescription

medications to take their own lives. For our coalition, it serves as strong evidence for our continued utilization and promotion of the unwanted medication disposal program. The data in this category also reinforces the need to educate our community by offering Question, Persuade, and Refer (QPR) classes as well as Mental Health First Aid classes.

Also in this category, we found that New Lenox Police Department data to track violent crime was very useful. We will continue to utilize this data to monitor violent crime in our community and were pleased to note a decrease in violent crime since 2011.

Workplace Injuries

As noted in the Injury Data section, we've attempted to do some work in this area byway-of a survey sent out to Chamber of Commerce businesses. Unfortunately the sampling was very small and there wasn't much information that could be gleaned from the survey.

In addition, we found shortcomings in the New Lenox Fire Protection District data in terms of classification of workplace injuries. As previously noted, their system has difficulty determining whether the injury is a "workplace injury," or an injury in a workplace. Moving forward, steps will be taken to differentiate between the two.

The really good news in this area is our new found partnership with Dr. Linda Forst and her colleagues at the University of Illinois at Chicago. Dr. Forst gave an excellent presentation to our coalition on November 18th and we are very excited about the new partnership. We believe that Dr. Forst will be able to not only help us collect data in this category, but other categories as well. We really just scratched the surface in terms of the possibilities and look forward to working with Dr. Forst as we move into 2016.

Emergency Preparedness

As noted in the Injury Data section, we are fortunate that there is no data to report in this section. That said, it doesn't mean that this category isn't important; it is. It's important because it's not a question of "if," but "when?" (a disaster will strike). Fortunately we have taken this category very seriously and have created a number of emergency preparedness initiatives. Each of these programs, whether it's the Community Emergency Response Team, Search & Rescue Team, or Storm Ready Community designation, will reduce injuries and deaths when a disaster strikes. We're fortunate to have these programs in place and even more fortunate to have outstanding volunteers who help spread the preparedness message throughout our community.

III. Effective strategies to address unintentional and intentional injuries

Coalition-driven strategies should be promising or evidence based and fall within six key areas: Motor vehicle, including distracted and teen driving and child passenger safety; Older adult falls; Poisoning by prescription drug overdoses; Workplace safety - on and off-the-job; Violence and suicide prevention; Emergency preparedness. Include current activities and plans for the future.

Injury Area: Older Adult Falls

Project Name: Matter of Balance

Project Goal: Reduce falls and the fear of falling in the older adult population (65+).

Project Description: This coalition–driven strategy is an evidence based, 8-week, 8-session, program that combines lecture, videos, and exercise to reduce falls and is led by certified Matter of Balance Coaches.

Is this promising or evidence based? Include the source: This is an evidence based program developed at the Roybal Center at Boston University http://www.mainehealth.org/mob

Target group (age, gender, vulnerable population): Older adults (65+), including males and females.

Length of Project: Ongoing. 18 classes have been taught since April 22, 2013. Our plan is to continue offering four Matter of Balance classes annually, which will train 48 seniors.

Partners: NLPD, New Lenox Township, New Lenox Fire Protection District, Senior Services of Will County, Pinnacle Physical Therapy, and many community volunteers.

Injury Area: Older Adult Falls

Project Name: Fit and Strong

Project Goal: Reduce falls in the older adult population (65+).

Project Description: This coalition–driven strategy is an evidence based, 8-week, 24-session program that combines walking, low impact aerobics, lower extremity strength conditioning, stretching and flexibility exercises, along with lectures, which is led by certified Fit and Strong Instructors.

Is this promising or evidence based? This is an evidence based program developed by the University of Illinois at Chicago, Institute for Health Research and Policy http://fitandstrong.org/

Target group (age, gender, vulnerable population): Older adults (65+), including males and females.

Length of Project: Ongoing. Two classes have been taught since June 15, 2015. Our plan is to continue offering two Fit and Strong classes annually, which will train 50 seniors.

Partners: NLPD, New Lenox Township, Pinnacle Physical Therapy, and many community volunteers

Injury Area: Violence and Suicide Prevention

Project Name: Question, Persuade and Refer (QPR)

Project Goal: Reduce the number of completed and attempted suicides in the community.

Project Description: This coalition-driven strategy is a 1 ½ - 2hr. class that increases awareness of suicide and improves one's ability to identify and refer those at risk for suicide. Includes myths, facts, warning signs, risk factors and early intervention techniques.

Is this promising or evidence based? This is an evidence based program developed by the QPR Institute <u>www.qprinstitute.com.</u> Also listed on SAMHSA's National Registry of Evidence-Based Programs and Practices http://nrepp.samhsa.gov/ViewIntervention.aspx?id=299.

Target group (age, gender, vulnerable population): Teens thru older adults, including males and females.

Length of Project: Ongoing. Five QPR classes have been held since April 10, 2014. Our plan is to continue offering four QPR classes annually, which will train 100 citizens.

Partners: Sertoma Centre, Crisis Line of Will-Grundy County, and NAMI of Will-Grundy County.

Injury Area: Violence and Suicide Prevention

Project Name: Mental Health First Aid

Project Goal: Reduce the number of completed and attempted suicides in the community.

Project Description: This coalition-driven strategy is an 8-hr. class that discusses the warning signs of major depression and suicidal behavior, as well as the risk factors and warning signs for suicidal and self-injury behavior.

Is this promising or evidence based? This is a promising and best practice program http://www.mentalhealthfirstaid.org

Target group (age, gender, vulnerable population): Teens thru older adults, including males and females.

Length of Project: Ongoing. Three classes have been held since November 11, 2013. Our plan is to continue offering two Mental Health First Aid classes annually, which will train 70 citizens.

Partners: NLPD, Sertoma Centre, Linden Oaks, NAMI of Will – Grundy County, and the Crisis Line of Will – Grundy County.

Injury Area: Poisoning by Prescription Drug Overdose

Project Name: Unwanted Medication Disposal Program

Project Goal: Provide a safe method for disposal of unwanted medications to prevent abuse among teens and misuse by older adults.

Project Description: This coalition–driven strategy provides a secure disposal container located at the New Lenox Police Department for the disposal of over-the-counter and prescription medications. Medications are separated, weighed, and properly disposed of pursuant to EPA guidelines.

Target group (age, gender, vulnerable population): Teens thru older adults, including males and females.

Length of Project: Ongoing. Approximately 1,200 pounds of unwanted medications are collected annually and since the inception of the program on March 24, 2009. Our plan is to continue offering the Unwanted Medication Disposal Program and increase annual collection totals by 10% each year.

Partners: NLPD, Will County Resource, Recovery and Energy, AVP Counseling and DUI Services, Inc., and Rosecrance

Injury Area: Emergency Preparedness

Project Name: Community Emergency Response Team (CERT)

Project Goal: Reduce injuries and deaths resulting from natural, technological, and intentional disasters.

Project Description: This coalition–driven strategy includes providing citizens with a 20-Hour Basic CERT Class, which teaches disaster preparedness, fire safety, medical operations, light search & rescue, disaster psychology, terrorism and team organization, followed by a practical exercise. Ongoing monthly training and community events help strengthen the program's ability for citizens to assist first responders during disasters.

Target group (age, gender, vulnerable population): Teens thru older adults, including males and females.

Length of Project: Ongoing. Through 10 classes, over 300 residents have been trained since the inception of the program on Sept. 9, 2009. Our plan is to continue to offer two 20-Hour Basic CERT classes annually, which will train 70 citizens.

Partners: NLPD, Will County Emergency Management Agency, Illinois Emergency Management Agency, Federal Emergency Management Agency and the New Lenox Fire Protection District.



- New Lenox's Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program which continues to thrive. CERT is
 designed to help a citizen protect themselves, their family, their neighbors, and their neighborhood in an
 emergency situation. New Lenox continues to maintain a team of volunteer citizens who assist the
 community in emergency and non-emergency functions. Current team members participate in monthly
 training and team building activities to keep their skills. To build on the team, annual 20 hour CERT
 classes are offered to the community.
- New Lenox has formed a Ground Search and Rescue (SAR) team. This volunteer team was formed to assist in the search for and provision of aid to people who are in distress or imminent danger. This team trains monthly with New Lenox and also with other SAR teams in the greater Will County area.
- New Lenox also holds a StormReady community designation through the National Weather Service. To achieve and maintain this designation, New Lenox needed to establish a 24-hour warning point and emergency operations center; having more than one way to receive weather warnings and forecasts and to alert the public; create a system that monitors weather conditions locally; promote the importance of readiness through community seminars; and, develop a formal hazardous weather plan, which includes training severe weather spotters and holding emergency exercises. This certification process needs to be renewed every three years. New Lenox continues to build on this program by providing weather alerts through their Nixle system. New Lenox also hold successful severe weather spotter course annually for emergency responders and general public, which includes a Health and Safety Expo that provides additional preparedness information to your citizens.

As we look to the next five years, Will County Emergency Management Agency expresses their support to the New Lenox Safe Communities Coalition.

Task Group Reports

Older Adults Falls Prevention – Laura Regis

Laura reported that the task force met this week and reviewed their goals for 2016. It was decided by the group that per year 4 Matter of Balance as well as 2 Fit & Be Strong will be held. This was chosen because of last year's classes creating a snowball effect with the number of classes being held.

Presentation / Guest Speakers – Sue Meyers and Teena Mackey / NAMI of Will-Grundy County

The 18th Matter of Balance Class began on Monday, September 14th and is being held every Monday from 9:30 am until 11:30 am at the New Lenox VFW through November 6, 2015. The classes are being taught by Laura Regis, Sherry Scherdin, and Linda Paschal with Norma Cason auditing the sessions. The next Matter of Balance Class will be scheduled for the Spring of 2016.

Laura also reported on the fact that Fit and Strong Class #2 began on Monday, September 14th at the Guy Sell Senior Center. Classes are held every Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 1:00 pm until 2:30 pm for 8 weeks with graduation scheduled for Friday, November 6th. Fit and Strong Class #3 is anticipated to begin in the Spring of 2016.

A full day Matter of Balance Coach Training Class was held on Tuesday, September 15th where four new coaches were trained to assist with planned balance classes in 2016 and going forward. The class was taught by "Master" instructors Noe Santiago, Laura Regis and Kathie Johnson. Those receiving Matter of Balance Coach Certification were Bonnie DuCharme, Janice Pomp, Karen Malone and Norma Cason.

In addition, National Falls Prevention Awareness Day was held Wednesday, September 23rd at the Guy Sell Senior Center where attendance by seniors was somewhat improved over last year's participation but the overall turnout was disappointing. A simultaneous Fit and Strong Class was being held and many of the attendees joined in for a few of the exercises. Booths were manned by Provena - St. Joseph Medical Center personnel where balance testing was done and Walgreens Pharmacy where free flu shots were provided. Additional information and direction was provided by the New Lenox Fire Protection District, the New Lenox Community Park District, New Lenox Township, TRIAD and the New Lenox Safe Communities America Coalition. Laura Regis reported that planning is already underway to improve and expand the National Falls Prevention Awareness Day Program for 2016.

Approval of the August 27, 2014 Meeting Minutes

The minutes for the August 27, 2014 meeting were sent to members via email prior to the meeting. Liz Schwenke made a motion to approve the minutes as presented, seconded by Emily Johnson. After no further discussion, the motion carried and the minutes were approved.

Guest Speaker

Dan Martin introduced Tess Benham, Program Manager, from the National Safety Council (NSC) who was kind enough to make the drive from NSC Headquarters in Itasca, IL for a presentation on prescription medications in the workplace. Tess began her presentation by stating that overdose is now the leading cause of unintentional death in the United States. Furthermore, prescription painkillers (opioids) are the leading cause of overdose. Opioids increase the risk of traffic crashes, falls, workplace injury and injuries within communities.

The United States contains 4.6% of the world's population but consumes 80% of the world's opioid medication. The U.S. consumes enough opioid medication to supply every citizen with 700mg of morphine every year. Not only are opioids dangerous, but they are not very good pain medications in terms of treating acute and chronic pain. Tess provided those in attendance with statistical data (via PowerPoint slides) of opioid sales, deaths and opioid treatment admissions from 1999 to 2010. The graph showed upward trends in all three areas. Tess also provided information about effectiveness of pain medications. Interestingly, a combination of ibuprophen and acetaminophen was more effective in controlling pain that the opioid pain medications.

Tess went on to say that, the National Safety Council is currently doing the following to address this issue:

- Policy development
 - o NGA
- Employer education and assistance
 o Employer toolkit
- Prescriber education
 - Practice guidelines with AAFP, ACP
- Community / public education
 - Community toolkit

Tess entertained questions throughout the presentation and provided her contact information as well as contact information for her colleague, Dr. Don Teater, Medical Advisor to the National Safety Council. Dan Martin thanked Tess for the presentation and invited her to stay for the remainder of the meeting, which she did.

Rachel Ridge will be the main speaker for the evening and will be joined by a doctor from Clinical Associates in Medicine. In addition to Rachel (who will also play a YouTube video detailing the lives of teens affected by prescription medications) and the doctor, Arnie has also asked a woman who is still in recovery from prescription medications, to speak. Arnie encouraged those in attendance to attend the event.

Guest Speaker

Dan Martin introduced Phil Pfeifer from Sports Brain, who introduced his colleague Roy Kessel, also from Sports Brain. Phil and Roy provided those in attendance with some alarming statistics regarding sports-related concussions (estimated 4 million in the U.S. every year); every three minutes a child is seen in an emergency department for a sports-related concussion; and doctors look at 22 potential side effects when evaluating a concussion.

Phil and Roy utilized a PowerPoint for their discussion, pointing out the dangers of concussions, including causes, symptoms and treatment for young athletes. Phil and

Roy stressed that proper testing will ensure that when an athlete suffers a concussion, the baseline test results can be used for several important purposes (also from their brochure that was provided to those in attendance:

- Helping identify diminished performance in the areas of cognitive function, vision, balance or reaction time;
- Providing the athlete's medical provider with objective, quantitative data that can be used to guide the athlete's recovery; and
- Ensuring that the athlete does not return to play before they are fully recovered which places the athlete at much greater risk for subsequent injury (ie. Second-Impact Syndrome).

Phil and Roy handled questions throughout the presentation, which concluded at approximately 3:10pm.

New Business

Dan Martin advised that the next meeting (September 24, 2014) would be "Bring Your Boss" (CEO, Administrators, etc...). Dan advised that Tess Benham from the National Safety Council would be the guest speaker and she will be speaking about prescription drug use in the workplace. Dan added that Tess would be bringing employer toolkits, which will be available to each of the organizations in attendance.

Workplace Safety

Cindy Staskiewicz provided a synopsis of the August 21, 2014 Task Group Meeting which included two Action Plans the group was working on:

Pat explained that she is searching for a local group that offers services but if no local groups provide services to survivors, she would be interested in starting a group. Patricia advised that she would continue her research and brief the group as to her findings at the next meeting.

Poisoning by Prescription Drug Overdose

Arnie Pilmonas advised that the prescription drug overdose event planned for Wednesday September 24th is still a go. Arnie advised that he has been promoting the event with his clients and at various events, which he attends. Arnie advised that Rachel Ridge from Rosecrance came up with "Coming to Light – the Dark Side of Prescription Medications" as the official name for the event. Emergency Preparedness - Al Murry / New Lenox CERT

Al Murry provided a synopsis of the assistance that he's provided to Trinity Services in the area of emergency preparedness.

In addition to Al's report, Dan Martin provided those in attendance with an update on the New Lenox Community Emergency Response Team (CERT), New Lenox Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) and the New Lenox Search and Rescue (SAR) Team. The update included training and community events that the teams have recently completed.

<u>Motor Vehicle / Traffic Safety – Marisa Schrieber / New Lenox Fire Protection District</u> Marisa Schrieber advised that the April 22nd Child Booster Seat event at NLFPD Station #1 was a success. Approximately 20 people attended the event and 20 seats were given to those that participated in the event. In addition, Marisa advised that during the last Task Group meeting (May 14th), the group discussed following some of the NHTSA Traffic Safety Campaigns. For example, the week of September 14-20 is Child Passenger Safety Week and it's feasible that a child passenger safety event could be held during that week. Marisa also noted that during the Task Group Meeting, National Safety Council resources were discussed. Those included materials for Distracted Driving Awareness Month, videos, employer cell phone policy kit and statistical data related to traffic crashes. The Task Group is also looking into the feasibility of purchasing or renting a "distracted driving simulator" for the purpose of raising awareness about distracted driving.

<u>Older Adults Falls Prevention – Noe Santiago / Pinnacle Physical Therapy</u> Noe Santiago provided a synopsis of the May 14th Older Adults Falls Prevention Task Group Meeting. The synopsis included information regarding the recent completion of New Lenox Matter of Balance (MOB) Class #4, which was held at the VFW and graduated on May 12th. Noe also mentioned that MOB Class #5 at Encore Senior Village also went well and graduated today (May 28th). Noe also mentioned that MOB Class #6 started on May 13th and is being held at New Lenox Fire Protection District Station #1. MOB Class #7 will start on July 7th and will be held at the New Lenox Public Library. Noe also advised that Older Adult Falls Prevention Task Group members discussed several things related to the MOB classes. Items included Noe introducing the exercises in week #3, Kathie Johnson scheduling a pharmacist during week #6, Kathie Johnson scheduling a health care professional (Noe will be the back-up) for week #7, and immediately following graduations during week #8, there will be a "lunch and learn." Liz Schwenke advised that Presence Saint Joseph Medical Center will provide the doctor for the presentation and will sponsor the lunch (snacks if it's an afternoon class). Noe advised that he will work with Kathie Johnson regarding the development of "Senior Health Fairs" that will include MOB graduates as well as those that attend the TRIAD meetings.

Dan Martin briefed those in attendance regarding a grant from Northeastern Illinois Agency on Aging, which will provide funding for New Lenox MOB classes 8, 9, 10, and 11.

Poisoning by Prescription Drug Overdose – Arnie Pilmonas / AVP Counseling Services Arnie Pilmonas provided a synopsis of the May 14th Poisoning by Prescription Drug Overdose Task Group Meeting. The synopsis included information regarding the New Lenox Police Department's Unwanted Medication Disposal Program. Arnie created a flyer to help promote the program and provided those in attendance with copies. Liz Schwenke advised that she would ask the Graphics Department at Presence Saint Joseph Medical Center to make a "professional" flyer for distribution. Liz advised that she hoped to have the flyer available for the next meeting.

Arnie advised that Marta Keane had mentioned that Will County Land Use would be hosting a few Household Hazardous Waste and Recycling events in the near future. Events include one on May 31st (Shorewood/Joliet), one on June 14th (Elwood) and one on September 13th (New Lenox – in conjunction with ShareFest).

Arnie also mentioned that Rachel Ridge from Rosecrance will be screening the movie Anonymous People later in the evening (May 28th). Flyers for the movie were made available for those in attendance.

Lastly, Arnie told the group about a "symposium" on the dangers of prescription drug overdose that the group discussed at the meeting. It was suggested that the event be held this Fall and would include a number of panelists (experts) that could inform the audience about this issue, which is reaching epidemic levels across the country. The Poisoning by Prescription Drug Overdose Task Group will continue to work on the details of the symposium and pass along information as it becomes available.

Suicide Prevention and Awareness - Dan Martin / NLPD

Dan Martin advised that the Suicide Prevention and Awareness Task Group is working with Derek Harris and Sertoma Centre to host another Question, Persuade and Refer (QPR) class for the community. The class is scheduled for July 9th from 7:00pm to 8:30pm in the Community Room at the New Lenox Village Hall. Martin advised that a

flyer has been created and is being distributed throughout the community. Copies were made available to those in attendance.

Dan Martin also provided those in attendance with a synopsis of the May 15th Suicide Prevention and Awareness Task Group Meeting. The group discussed the success of the April 10th QPR Class at the Village Hall which was attended by 31 residents. In addition, task group members also discussed hosting another Mental Health First Aid Class, possibly with the assistance of Sertoma Centre. The group also discussed a document "A Prioritized Research Agenda for Suicide Prevention: An Action Plan to Save Lives," by the Action Alliance for Suicide Prevention. The group also discussed New Lenox statistical data for suicide threats, suicide attempts, and completed suicides from January 2014 to May 15th. Martin noted the importance of the Task Groups working together and used the example of a 17-year old ingesting her mother's old prescription medication. This example directly relates to the Poisoning by Prescription Drug Overdose Task Group and the Unwanted Medication Disposal Program.

Workplace Safety - Cindy Staskiewicz

Cindy Staskiewicz provided a synopsis of the May 15th Workplace Safety Task Group meeting. Cindy advised that she and Dan Martin worked on an Action Plan to reduce injuries and deaths in the workplace. This particular Action Plan included the development of a survey that will be provided to local businesses with the goal of learning what types of injuries are occurring in New Lenox workplaces. The results of the survey will help drive New Lenox Safe Communities programs and initiatives related to the reduction of injuries and deaths in the workplace.

Another Action Plan that was discussed at the last task group meeting was one related to the development of a "model" safety plan or emergency action plan for local businesses. It's recognized that some small businesses do not have the resources to develop these plans so the goal will be design a template that businesses can utilize, modify and adopt.

Cindy also advised that in furtherance of the task group's mission, she's identified a number of useful web sites to view workplace injury data.

Youth Sports, Health and Safety - Jessica Jepsen / Chiro One Wellness

Jessica Jepsen advised that the Task Group is currently working on the development of sports injury prevention flyer(s) that will be made available to youth athletic associations groups and others. For example, the flyer would include a description of a particular injury along with signs and symptoms, treatment and prevention. The flyer(s) will contain pictures and graphics our Safe Communities logo and a disclaimer. Lauren Lotz advised that she would assist the design of the flyer(s). In addition, Lauren suggested that the flyer(s) can be laminated and given to coaches to place on their clipboards or on their backpacks.

Announcements / Organization Updates

Those in attendance shared current news and events relevant to their organizations. Dan advised that he would be willing to forward electronic copies of materials that would be beneficial to the group.

Everyone thanked Margaret for her presentation and Margaret was kind enough to stay for the meeting as well.

New Business

Safe Communities America Annual Report

Dan Martin advised those in attendance that he was in the process of submitted the Safe Communities America Annual Report on behalf of the New Lenox Safe Communities America Coalition. Martin went on to say that the Safe Communities Annual Report included two parts. Part One, the "Online Program Data and Impact Report" as the name suggests, is submitted online. Part Two, the "Coalition Program Matrix," is an Excel document which is submitted via email. Both Parts One and Two are similar, in that they are seeking information regarding our coalition's efforts in three areas. Martin provided an example of our coalition's work in Motor Vehicle Traffic Safety, Older Adults Falls Prevention as well as Suicide Prevention and Awareness.

Old Business

Task Group Reports

Emergency Preparedness - Al Murry / New Lenox CERT

Al Murry provided a synopsis of the initiatives that his Task Group was working on. Al spent a good amount of time speaking about the assistance that he's providing to Trinity Services, which included a recent emergency preparedness provided to approximately 35 Trinity staff members. Al also explained plans for visiting Trinity homes throughout Will County for the purpose of ensure that the homes (staff and clients) are prepared. Al will be looking for 72-hour disaster supply kits, NOAA weather radios, identification of

severe weather shelter locations, installation of smoke detectors, etc... Al also spoke about a recent emergency preparedness presentation for New Lenox School District #122 PTO members and guests as well as Patty Edgett's "Ready Kids Club." Dan Martin also added a brief update on New Lenox CERT / MRC / SAR as well as details regarding the March 5th Severe Weather Spotter Training / Health and Safety Expo.

<u>Motor Vehicle / Traffic Safety – Marisa Schrieber / New Lenox Fire Protection District</u> Marisa Schrieber advised that she recently applied for and received a \$1000.00 grant related to child safety seats. Marisa went on to say that the grant requires that 75% of the monies be spent on the actual seats which should yield 30-40 seats. Marisa went on to say that she's planning a Child Car Seat Safety event from 6:00pm to 8:00pm on April 22, 2014. The event will be held at New Lenox Fire Protection District Station One with additional details forthcoming.

Older Adults Falls Prevention – Noe Santiago / Pinnacle Physical Therapy

Noe Santiago advised that the Older Adults Fall Prevention Task Group met at 1:00pm, just prior to the Safe Communities / Citizen Corps Council Meeting. Noe advised that the Task Group discussed guest speakers for future Matter of Balance Classes, which include local pharmacists, doctors, and physical therapists. Noe also provided a brief overview of a recent MOB Coaches class that was held on February 19th at Encore Senior Village. Noe (MOB Master Instructor) taught the class which graduated 12 new coaches. Noe also advised that the Task Group is planning another three local MOB classes, taught by the new coaches. The classes will be as follows:

- MOB Class 4: Starting March 24th (Mondays) thru May 12th, 9:30am 11:30am at New Lenox VFW Post 9545, 323 Old Hickory Road, New Lenox, IL 60451.
- MOB Class 5: Starting April 9th (Wednesdays) thru May 28th, 9:30am 11:30am at Encore Senior Village, 1023 S. Cedar Road, New Lenox, IL 60451.
- MOB Class 6: Starting May 13th (Tuesdays) thru July 1st, 1:00pm 3:00pm at New Lenox Fire Protection District Station 1, 261 E. Maple Street, New Lenox, IL 60451.

Lastly, Noe advised that Task Group members, including MOB Coaches, will staff the a MOB table at the March 5th Health and Safety Expo at Lincoln-Way West High School. It is hoped that seniors attending the event will sign-up for the classes while visiting the table.

Poisoning by Prescription Drug Overdose – Arnie Pilmonas / AVP Counseling Services Arnie Pilmonas advised that the Poisoning by Prescription Drug Overdose Task Group is currently working on an Action Plan related to the Unwanted Medication Disposal Program. Arnie advised that he drafted an Action Plan that includes a 10% increase in unwanted medications by the end of 2014. Arnie advised that he will be working with Dan Martin and other Task Group members on this Action Plan. Arnie also advised that he has ordered materials from the National Institute on Drug Abuse that he'll have available at the March 5th Health and Safety Expo. The materials include pamphlets describing the brain's response to prescription drugs as well as posters about prescription drug abuse. Lastly, Arnie advised that he was going to recommend that the New Lenox Police Department participate in the next National Take-Back Initiative, which will be held on Saturday April 26, 2014.

Suicide Prevention and Awareness – Dan Martin / NLPD

Dan Martin advised that the Suicide Prevention and Awareness Task Group is working with Derek Harris and Sertoma Centre to host a Question, Persuade and Refer (QPR) class for the community. The class is scheduled for April 10, 2014 from 7:00pm to 8:30pm in the Community Room at the New Lenox Village Hall. Martin advised that a flyer has been created and is being distributed throughout the community. In addition, Derek Harris advised that he will be at the March 5th Health and Safety Expo and will be distributing the flyers at the Sertoma Centre table.

Workplace Safety – Cindy Staskiewicz

Cindy Staskiewicz provided a synopsis of the January 14, 2014 Task Group meeting. Cindy advised that she is currently looking for statistical data related to workplace injuries, which will help in providing guidance to the Task Group. Community Coalition Action Theory

Dan Martin advised that he had recently attended a Safe Communities America Workshop at the National Safety Council Headquarters in Itasca, IL. Frances Butterfoss, PhD, MED and President of Coalitions Work also attended the meeting. Donna Stein-Harris from the National Safety Council requested Dr. Butterfoss attend the workshop to her Community Coalition Action Theory.

Dan provided a brief overview of the model, which includes the various developmental stages of coalitions. In summary, the model flows in the following order: Community Context (input) > Lead Agency / Group Convener > Coalition Membership > Processes, Leadership / Staffing & Structures > Collaborative Synergy (Member Engagement & Pooled Resources) > Assessment & Planning / Implementation Strategies > Community Change Outcomes, including Community Capacity and Health / Social Outcomes. The model essentially moves from coalition formation, to maintenance, to institutionalization. Dan provided those in attendance with Dr. Butterfoss' model, which explains each of the

steps. Dan suggested that everyone review the model at their leisure and noted that our group (unknowingly) has followed this model since its inception.

Emergency Preparedness - Al Murry / New Lenox CERT

Al advised that the Emergency Preparedness Task Group met on January 16, 2014 at 10:00am in the Training Room at the New Lenox Police Department. Al advised that the following Mission was developed for the group: **"The Emergency Preparedness Task Group will encourage citizens to take personal responsibility to be prepared through the development of programs, initiatives and strategies designed to promote safety and whole community preparedness."** In addition, a synopsis of the meeting, Al advised that he is working on a project with Trinity Services wherein training in the area of emergency preparedness will be provided to Trinity Staff. In addition, ideas are being discussed for Al to conduct visits of the Trinity homes (approximately 100) to ensure they are properly prepared for emergencies and disasters. So for example, Al would create a checklist to determine if each of the homes had a fire extinguisher, NOAA Weather Radio, 3-day supply of water/food, etc...

Motor Vehicle / Traffic Safety – Marisa Schrieber / New Lenox Fire Protection District Marisa advised that the Motor Vehicle / Traffic Safety Task Group met on January 16, 2014 at 10:30am in the Training Room at the New Lenox Police Department. Marisa advised that the following Mission was developed for the group: **"To establish collaborative partnerships with organizations that utilize education, engineering and enforcement efforts to reduce deaths and injuries related to motor vehicle crashes."** In addition to providing a synopsis of the meeting, Marisa advised that she recently submitted a grant to purchase child safety seats and included the New Lenox Safe Communities America Coalition as a partner. Marisa will keep the group informed as to the outcome of the grant and future event related to the car seat giveaway and installation.

Older Adults Falls Prevention – Noe Santiago / Pinnacle Physical Therapy Noe advised that the Older Adults Fall Prevention Task Group met on January 16, 2014 at 1:00pm in the Training Room at the New Lenox Police Department. Noe advised that the following Mission was developed for the group: **"To reduce injuries and deaths in the 65 and over population through the utilization of evidence-based and other programs designed to reduce falls and the fear of falling."** In addition to providing a synopsis of the meeting, Noe advised that he would be teaching a Matter of Balance (8hour) Coaches Class on February 19, 2014 at Encore Senior Living. Kathie Johnson added that over a dozen individuals have registered for the class and 10 slots are being sponsored by Encore. Noe advised that following the completion of the class, one or more Matter of Balance Classes will be scheduled locally. The ability to offer these classes to our seniors has increased because our "pool" of coaches continues to expand. Poisoning by Prescription Drug Overdose – Arnie Pilmonas / AVP Counseling Services Arnie advised that the Poisoning by Prescription Drug Overdose Task Group met on January 16, 2014 at 2:30pm in the Training Room at the New Lenox Police Department. Arnie advised that the following Mission was developed for the group: **"To reduce injuries and deaths associated with poisoning by prescription drug overdose through the establishment of collaborative partnerships and the implementation of educational programs, strategies and initiatives." In addition to providing a synopsis of the meeting, Arnie advised that he would develop an Action Plan regarding the existing Unwanted Medication Disposal Program with the goal of increasing collection of medications by 10% in 2014.**

Suicide Prevention and Awareness – Dan Martin / NLPD

Dan advised that the Suicide Prevention and Awareness Task Group met on January 14, 2014 at 10:00am in the Training Room at the New Lenox Police Department. Dan advised that the following Mission was developed for the group: **"To reduce deaths and injuries related to suicide, through the development of educational programs, initiatives and strategies that address factors which lead to the attempt or completion of suicide."** Dan advised that the Task Group is currently looking at statistical data for New Lenox suicides and attempt suicides. Examples of data include, male or female, age group, method and reason (if known). Dan explained that it is important to understand which groups are at risk, at least statistically, in order to provide preventative programs and initiatives. Dan also added that the group is working with Derek Harris from Sertoma Center to bring a QPR (Question, Persuade, Refer) class to New Lenox this Spring. Additional information such as the date, time and location will be shared as soon as it is available.

Workplace Safety – Dan Martin / NLPD

Dan advised that the Workplace Safety Task Group met on January 14, 2014 at 1:00pm in the Training Room at the New Lenox Police Department. Dan advised that Cindy Staskiewicz, a New Lenox resident, attended the meeting and is very excited to help as she has experience in this field. In addition, Cindy agreed to Chair the Task Group but could not attend today's meeting due to a conflict with her schedule. On behalf of Cindy, Dan advised that the following Mission was developed for the group: **"To reduce injuries and deaths occurring in the workplace through the development of educational programs, strategies and initiatives."** Dan advised that the group will be gathering additional statistical data to determine which injury prevention areas to pursue. In addition, the group will be seeking assistance from additional organizations with experience in workplace safety. Lastly, the group discussed Action Plans and how they will be beneficial to the group moving forward.

Youth Sports, Health and Safety – Jessica Jepsen / Chiro One Wellness Jessica advised that the Youth Sports, Health and Safety Task Group met on January 14, 2014 at 2:30pm in the Training Room at the New Lenox Police Department. Jessica advised that the following Mission was developed for the group: **"To improve the health and safety of young athletes and reduce sports injuries through the development of educational programs, strategies and initiatives."** Jessica advised that the group discussed various types of statistical data that could be utilized to assist with the fulfillment of the mission. Katie Christopherson from ATI was in attendance (also Co-Chair of the Task Group) and mentioned that ATI has a sports medicine database that's utilized with the Jr. Knights youth football program. <u>New Membership – Dryer Vent Wizard of Will County Represented by Joe</u> Enzenberger

Dan Martin reminded those in attendance that Joe Enzenberger was the guest speaker at the August 28th meeting where he gave a great presentation on the hazards of home dryer fires that often occur as a result of "failure to clean" dryer vents. Dan invited Joe and his company to become a collaborative partner which he accepted and graciously returned to attend the meeting. At this time Dan made a formal motion to accept Dryer Vent Wizard of Will County, represented by Joe Enzenberger, to join the group. A second to the motion was provided by Lisa Kline. After no further discussion, the motion carried and everyone congratulated Joe.

New Business

New Lenox Safe Communities America Facebook Page

Dan Martin advised those in attendance that the New Lenox Safe Communities America Facebook Page was up and running. Dan advised that he went through participating organization's Facebook Pages and "Liked" them. Dan requested that everyone do the same, personally as well as professionally through their organizations. In addition, Dan requested that someone assist in the role of "Admin" for the page which would enhance the page's effectiveness and efficiency. Dan requested that if anyone was interested in assisting to send him an email.

Safe Communities America Annual Conference Synopsis

Dan Martin provided those in attendance with a synopsis of the Annual Safe Communities America Conference which was held in Chicago on September 29th and 30th in conjunction with the National Safety Council's "Congress." Dan stated that the conference was excellent and would be sharing much of the information that was presented.

- Future Injury Trends: Dan provided everyone in attendance with copies of a PowerPoint that was given at the conference by Ken Kolosh, Statistics Manager for the National Safety Council. Based on Ken's projections, the median age of the U.S. population is rising (36.4 in 2015 to 40.1 in 2060). Life expectancy will be rising for both males (77.1 in 2015 to 82.8 in 2060) and females (81.8 in 2015 to 86.8 in 2060). Race and ethnicity will be changing with a decrease in white / non-Hispanic population (60% in 2015 to 43% in 2060) and an increase in the Hispanic population (18% in 2015 to 31% in 2060). The labor force will be getting older (people working longer). Poisoning and falls from 1978 – 2010 have risen (poisoning +27% and falls +5%) where other categories have declined (overall -2%, motor vehicle -8%, fires-13%, drowning -12% and choking -1%). Based on Ken's predictions, poisoning and falls are clearly areas that should be focused on. The aging population will also bring about new challenges in the area of injuries, especially in the area of falls.
- Developing a Roadmap to Success: Dan provided everyone in attendance with a Road mapping Exercise Worksheet that was utilized at the conference. Dan advised that there were three Road mapping exercises conducted at the conference. They included prescription drug overdoses, emergency preparedness and suicide prevention. Dan went over his notes from the conference and led a discussion regarding these three areas highlighting best practices that are being utilized across the county. Dan added that as far as New Lenox goes, we're doing many of the things that were identified as best practices at the conference but there's always room for improvement.
- Elevator Speech: Dan provided everyone in attendance with a handout from the conference that provided some excellent suggestions regarding the development of an elevator speech. The purpose of the elevator speech is to develop a quick (60-90 seconds) spiel which outlines what our coalition does. It should include information about our target customers, customer needs, our products/services, market, key benefits, competition and what makes us unique. Dan provided an example as well as a sample letter for coalition members to utilize when attempting to attract new collaborative partners.
- Framework for Communications and Sustainability: Dan provided those in attendance with a handout from the conference of a DRAFT Communications and Sustainability Plan. The sample plan included programs such as those

dealing with prescription drug overdoses, motor vehicle safety and older adult falls. The plan included ideas for documenting program development and tracking statistical data related to the initiatives.

- Suggested Duties and Responsibilities: Dan provided those in attendance with handouts covering suggested duties and responsibilities for coalition members and coalition leaders. Dan advised that this document provides excellent guidance so everyone knows they're basic duties and responsibilities. Dan added that the good news is that it appears that we're following most of the recommendations outlined in the documents.
- Focus or Task Groups: Dan outlined the suggested Focus or Task Groups that our coalition should have in place, and for the most part do have in place. They include: Motor Vehicle Safety (including distracted and teen driving, child passenger restraint); Older Adults Falls Prevention; Poisoning by Prescription Drug Overdose (and other agents); Suicide Prevention and Awareness; Emergency Preparedness; Workplace Safety (on and off-the-job); and Youth Sports, Health and Safety (unique to New Lenox). Dan also provided those in attendance with a document of "proposed" Focus or Target Group assignments. Dan advised that he placed folks in areas where it made sense based on a coalition member's occupation or where previous interest has been expressed. Dan advised to let him know if anyone wanted to switch groups or add another group.

Suicide Prevention and Awareness

Dan Martin provided those in attendance with an update from the Suicide Prevention and Awareness Focus Group. Approval of the July 31, 2013 Meeting Minutes

The Meeting Minutes for the July 31, 2013 meeting were previously made available via email to Coalition Members. Lauren Lotz made a motion to approve the minutes as presented, seconded by Michele Batara. After no further discussion, the motion carried and the minutes were approved.

Presentation / Guest Speaker

Dan Martin introduced Joe Enzenberger from Dryer Vent Wizard of Will County as the guest speaker for the meeting. Joe was referred by Lisa Kline who had previously seen Joe's presentation at another event.

Joe thanked the group for the invitation and proceeded with a PowerPoint presentation which contained statistical data regarding home dryer fires that often times occur as a result of "failure to clean" dryer vents. Joe stated that "according to the U.S. Fire Administration, dryer fires account for an average of 15,000 fires with an approximate \$88 million in property damage, 15 deaths and 400 injuries annually."

Joe advised that he's been working with the New Lenox Fire Protection District as well as the National Fire Prevention Association to create consumer awareness by providing tips to minimize the risk of dryer fires. Joe's tips included the following:

- Be sure that dryer vent systems are up to code with city and state and per the manufacturer owner's manual.
- Replace any plastic or foil vent with semi-rigid or solid metal venting.
- Clean screen lint trays before and after drying a load.
- Wash lint screens with soap and water every few months to remove residue left behind by fabric softeners.
- Have dryer vents professionally cleaned and inspected annually.
- Don't keep combustibles like chemical cleaning products or chemical laden rags near your dryer.

Joe then noted the following warning signs to look for:

- Clothes are taking more than one cycle to dry, especially jeans and towels.
- No lint visible on lint screen.
- Dryer repeatedly stops during a cycle.
- Clothes have moldy smell after dry cycle.

Joe was kind enough to field questions from those in attendance. In addition, many commented that they were unaware of the "risks" of fires due to the failure to clean dryer vents. As such, the presentation was extremely worthwhile and those in attendance were grateful for the information. Dan Martin extended the invitation to Joe to return to the next meeting and that he consider becoming a collaborative member of the NLSCAC / NLCCC.

New Business

New Programs and Initiatives

Dan Martin advised that the NLSCAC was doing very well with regard to its existing programs and partnerships. That being said, Martin encouraged those in attendance to consider exploring new initiatives and programs consistent with the mission of the NLSCAC, as well as the NLCCC. Martin added that ideas do not necessarily have to fall into a member's work category as individuals might have a passion for a particular topic.

In addition, Martin encouraged those in attendance to participate in a focus group and listed examples as follows:

- Distracted Driving
- Prescription Drug Overdose
- Older Adult Falls
- Suicide Prevention
- Home Safety (fire / falls)
- Emergency Preparedness
- Emerging Issues (returning veterans, etc.)

During the discussion it was suggested that perhaps the NLSCAC / NLCCC can assist with a public education campaign regarding new legislation pertaining to no hand held cell phones (January 1, 2014). Martin advised that this would be an excellent suggestion and one that can definitely be undertaken.

Will County All Hazards Mitigation Plan Update

Dan Martin advised that he attended the Will County All Hazard Mitigation Plan Update Meeting at the New Lenox Public Library on August 27, 2013. Martin explained that the plan must be updated every five years in order to continue to be eligible for FEMA hazard mitigation project grant funding. The updating of the plan at the local level is the responsibility of the Will County Emergency Management Agency, with support and assistance from local municipalities. Mitigation plans identify hazards that:

- Impact communities
- Identify actions to reduce losses from those hazards
- Establish a coordinated process to implement the plan

Martin advised that he would continue to attend meetings and provide support as needed for the completion of the Will County All Hazard Mitigation Plan.

Old Business

Suicide Prevention and Awareness

Dan Martin provided those in attendance with an update from the Suicide Prevention and Awareness Focus Group. Martin advised that the 8-hour Mental Health and First Aid Course will be held on Tuesday November 5, 2013 in the Community Room at the New Lenox Village Hall. The course will be sponsored by the NLSCAC and taught by an instructor from Linden Oaks at Edwards Hospital. Martin advised that he's already had a number of responses for the course which has an ideal class size of 25-30. The class will be held from 8:00am to 4:30pm and the NLSCAC will provide lunch.

Martin advised that Michele Batara attended the Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST) Program in early August. Michele provided those in attendance with a synopsis of the training by advising:

- Anyone can attend the 2-day course.
- The course is designed to teach people how to provide a "safety plan" for those who are in danger.
- The program is designed to teach life saving skills and to keep those "at risk" safe.

Michele stated that she will be instructing a course in-house (at the Crisis Line of Will-Grundy County) as a "test" of her instructional skills. Michele advised that she hoped to be ready by the Spring of 2014 to offer the course to the NLSCAC and other interested parties. Martin advised that another program available to lay people is called "QPR" which stands for Question, Persuade and Refer. Martin advised that he had recently spoken to a QPR Instructor and hopes to schedule a course(s) locally in the near future.

Lastly, Martin reminded those in attendance that NAMI is having a walk in Chicago on September 21, 2013. Registration is available online at the NAMI web site.

Falls Prevention

Dan Martin provided those in attendance with an update on how the Falls Prevention (Matter of Balance) Program was going. Martin advised that MOB Class #2 graduated another 12 seniors on August 26th. Mayor Tim Baldermann was in attendance at the graduation. Mayor Baldermann congratulated the seniors on their accomplishment, thanked them for participating in the program and wished them well.

Martin went on to say that MOB Class #3 will begin on September 16th and will run through November 4th. MOB Class #3 will be taught by graduates of MOB Class #1 who recently completed the Coaches Course. Martin added that he was very pleased to see the "pool" of instructors increasing which is exactly what we had hoped would occur.

Martin recently learned that another MOB Class will be hosted by the New Lenox Public Library in partnership with Pinnacle Physical Therapy. Martin advised that he believed that class would be starting in early November.

Emergency Preparedness

Dan Martin provided a brief synopsis of recent CERT / MRC / SAR training and events. Martin advised that the New Lenox CERT / MRC / SAR had recently been involved in the following activities:

NMETS is set to go "live" in a few months.

New Business

New Member and Organization

Dan Martin introduced Liz Schwenke from Presence St. Joseph Medical Center. Dan explained that Liz and Presence St. Joseph Medical Center have been great partners to the New Lenox Safe Communities America Coalition, New Lenox Citizen Corps Council and Village of New Lenox. They continue to play a supportive role in a number of activities which include teaching medical techniques to our CERT / MRC volunteers and participating in our Annual Health and Safety Expo. Based on their presence within our community and continued support, it made sense to bring Liz and Presence St. Joseph Medical Center on board. Following Dan's introduction, Liz introduced herself to those in attendance and explained her duties and responsibilities with Presence St. Joseph Medical Center. Brenda Lutz then made a motion to approve Liz and Presence St.

Joseph Medical Center as a new member. Lauren Lotz seconded the motion. After no further discussion the motion was approved and Liz was welcomed to the Coalition.

New Member and Organization

Dan Martin introduced Patricia Hensley, Director of Senior Services of Will County. Dan explained that Pat and Senior Services of Will County have been great partners to the New Lenox Safe Communities America Coalition, New Lenox Citizen Corps Council and Village of New Lenox. They've played a supportive role in a number of activities including our Falls Prevention Program. Dan also summarized a recent visit that he and Kathie Johnson had made to Senior Services of Will County. Pat was kind enough to provide a tour of the facility and Dan explained that it was amazing to see all the wonderful programs that were in progress during the tour. Based on the good work being done within our community by Pat and Senior Services of Will County, it made sense to bring them on board. Following Dan's introduction, Pat introduced herself to those in attendance and explained her duties and responsibilities with Senior Services of Will County. Pat's overview included a brief description of some of their programs. Michele Batara then made a motion to approve Pat and Senior Services of Will County as a new member. Kathie Johnson seconded the motion. After no further discussion the motion was approved and Liz was welcomed to the Coalition.

New Member

Dan Martin advised that Jennifer Killeen, Associate Principal at Lincoln-Way West High School was unable to attend the meeting. Jennifer will be joining the Coalition in place of Associate Principal Rob Schiffbauer who will be moving over to a new position at the Lincoln-Way School District Office.

2013 Illinois Monthly Preparedness Campaigns

Brenda Lutz provided everyone in attendance with a flyer which outlines the 2013 Preparedness Campaigns in Illinois. Brenda advised that unfortunately no "tool kits" are available for these campaigns but when she receives information from the Illinois Emergency Management Agency or other sources regarding each month's activities, she'll pass the information along. Dan Martin advised that he would do the same.

Preparedness: The Whole Community

Brenda Lutz provided an overview of FEMA's "Preparedness: The Whole Community" program. Brenda explained that the program identifies roles and responsibilities for community stakeholders (businesses, local government, schools, residents, etc.). The program identifies things such as putting together a family emergency plan and a 72-hour disaster supply kit. It was great to see that many of the things outlined in the program are already being done through our local first responders, CERT, MRC and Citizen Corps Council.

Will County CERT Symposium

Brenda provided an overview of the Will County CERT Symposium which will take place on Saturday April 20, 2013 from approximately 8:00am to 4:00pm. The event will be held at the International Union of Operating Engineers (IUOE) Local 150's facility in Wilmington, IL. CERTs from Will, Grundy and Kankakee Counties have been invited to participated in this event which is being designed to facilitate networking between teams as well as training in *some* of the CERT program's core competencies (triage, treatment, search and transport). Brenda advised that the committee that is responsible for organizing this event is hoping for 200 participants from local CERTs.

Severe Weather Preparedness Workshop / Health and Safety Expo

Dan Martin provided an overview of this year's Severe Weather Preparedness Workshop / Health and Safety Expo. The event will take place at Lincoln-Way West High School on Tuesday March 5, 2013. The Health and Safety Expo will take place from 5:00pm – 7:00pm in the lobby area and hallway outside of the Performing Arts Center. Dan advised that over 40 organizations have already requested to participate, making this year's event the largest since its inception. The Severe Weather Preparedness Workshop will be held in the Performing Arts Center from 7:00pm – 8:30pm. Brenda Lutz continues to serve as a liaison to the National Weather Service Chicago Office (Romeoville, IL) who provides this training for our community each year. Brenda advised that this year's event will focus on preparing for severe weather.

Old Business

Suicide Prevention and Awareness

Dan Martin advised those in attendance that the Suicide Prevention and Awareness Focus Group met at the New Lenox Police Department at 10:00am on Tuesday January 22, 2013. There were 12 people in attendance representing organizations such as the Lincoln-Way School District, Silver Cross Hospital, Fishers of Men, Crisis Line of Will County, Providence Catholic High School and Presence St. Joseph Medical Center. During the meeting the 2012 National Strategy for Suicide Prevention was discussed, including its 13 Goals and 60 Objectives. Each representative was asked to review the document to determine if their respective organization is currently doing some of things outlined in the Strategy. The focus group also discussed creating a brochure which provides information and resources related to suicide and depression. The planning of a future event to raise awareness about suicide was also discussed.

Dan also shared some statistics about suicides in Will County that he obtained from the Will County Coroner's Office. Will County experienced 39 suicides in 2009, 50 in 2010, 52 in 2011 and 65 in 2012. In 2012 there were four suicides in New Lenox Township, having the following characteristics:

The next meeting of the Suicide Prevention and Awareness Focus Group will be on February 19th. A synopsis of the focus group meeting will be provided at the February 27th NLSCA / NLCCC Meeting.

Falls Prevention

Dan Martin advised those in attendance that he and Kathie Johnson would be attending a falls prevention instructor program on February 4th and 5th. The training is for a program called "A Matter of Balance" and will be held in Barrington, IL at Advocate Good Shepherd Hospital. The program is specifically designed to reduce the fear of falling, stop the fear of falling cycle and increase activity levels among communitydwelling older adults. The training is taught by trained facilitators utilizing a detailed training manual and two instruction videos. Dan added that two staff members from Senior Services of Will County will also be in attendance at the training. Having four "A Matter of Balance" trainers will definitely compliment what has already been done through our falls prevention program.

New Lenox CERT / MRC

Dan Martin provided an update on the New Lenox CERT / MRC which included a short synopsis of the semi-annual meeting, a new "Meetup Group" (<u>http://www.meetup.com/New-Lenox-Community-Emergency-Response-Team-CERT/</u>) and an upcoming training event which will provide civilians with helpful tips on how to handle an active shooter situation. Dan also shared that much work is being done with the MRC, including a new Facebook Page that was created on January 30th.

Announcements / Organization Updates

Dan Martin announced that plans for the next Safe Communities America Networking Conference were underway. The conference will be held in Chicago, September 29-30, 2013, in conjunction with the NSC 100th Anniversary Celebration at their Congress and Expo (congress.nsc.org). In addition to the Networking Conference, Safe Communities America attendees will be able to attend the Opening Session, Executive Forum, three Keynote Events, and a special social event, as well as full access to the Expo floor.

Nancy Hoehn announced the showing of the movie of Honor Flight at the AMC Showplace New Lenox 14 Theater on February 19th. Nancy provided everyone in attendance with a flyer which included details regarding how to purchase tickets.

Erika Leader announced that their foundation would be having a raffle and passed around flyers. Erika added that information would be mailed to all New Lenox Township residents. Erika shared that they had just completed a very successful babysitting class in which both girls and boys attended. Erika also announced that she would be leaving the New Lenox Fire Protection District in February and this would be her last NLSCAC / NLCCC Meeting. On behalf of the NLSCAC / NLCCC as well as the Village of New Lenox, Dan Martin thanked Erika for her service.

Lauren Lotz announced that they're currently working on the summer catalog and mentioned that there will be some new programs for residents.

Lisa Kline announced that the Lion's Club is having a "Garden Party Fashion Show" at the New Lenox VFW, beginning at 1:30pm. Lisa advised that she has tickets for those that are interested in attending this fundraiser.

Phil Pfeifer shared information about a company called "Sports Brain" that was doing good work in the area of concussions and brain injuries. Phil mentioned the somewhat recent prevalence of suicides in the NFL and the research that suggests the relationship to prior concussions. It was suggested that perhaps the owner of Sports Brain would give a lecture on concussion treatment and recovery in the future. Lynn Bigelow mentioned that AthletiCo has recently received some national accolades, including best place to work in their industry. On a personal note, Lynn mentioned that she would be riding from New Orleans to Tallahassee to raise money for injured veterans. Lynn advised that she will be participating in the event from March 2nd thru the 9th and is seeking to raise \$3000.00. Lynn advised that anyone wishing to donate money for this event may contact her.

Pat Hensley advised that Senior Services of Will County is hosting a Mardi Gras Party on February 12th from 4:00pm – 7:00pm at Harrah's Casino in Joliet, IL. Monies raised during the event will go toward their home delivered meals program. The cost per ticket is \$25.00 and may be purchased through Senior Services.

John Mitchell advised that the American Red Cross is sponsoring a Shelter Managers Workshop on February 6th from 6:00pm – 9:30pm for New Lenox CERT / MRC. This training will be followed by a Shelter Drill on February 9th from 10:00am – 1:00pm. Both training events will be held at the New Lenox Village Hall.

Liz Schwenke advised that Presence St. Joseph Medical Center was recently ranked by Chicago Magazine as one of Chicago's top hospitals. Liz also mentioned the recent addition of Aunt Martha's to their facility. Liz also offered her services as a New Lenox Community Television (Channel 6) volunteer for coverage of events related to the NLSCAC and NLCCC.

Jackie Mansholt reminded everyone that it's not too late to get a flu shot as plenty of vaccines are still available.

Mary Jo Button shared that St. Jude's Parish was recently able to assist a number of indigent families with utility bills through parishioner donations. Mary Jo advised that the parish will continue to assist local charities through the generous donations of parishioners.

Gary Cheney advised that the 8th Annual Clergy & Men's Unity Breakfast will be held on Friday February 2nd at the Holiday Inn Conference Center in Joliet, IL. Gary advised that approximately 250 tickets have already been sold for the event which features

speakers, networking and live music. Gary advised that he's been asked to speak about ShareFest.

Tom Donegan advised that if any organization would like to have an Operation Lifesaver presentation to contact him. Tom also thanked the volunteers from New Lenox CERT / MRC for assisting with a (train) disaster drill in Richton Park, IL on December 29th. Tom added that he will be doing several similar drills in the months to come.

Kathie Johnson also reminded everyone about flu shots and spoke about shingles vaccinations for seniors. Kathie advised that with Medicare Part D the shots are approximately \$50.00 and with our Medicare Part D they're approximately \$200.00. Kathie added that New Lenox Township was busy around Christmas time, providing over 100 dinners to local families with the assistance of Jewel Foods. New Lenox Township also assisted the New Lenox Police Department with its "Shop with a Cop" event.

Call to Order

The meeting of the Safe Communities America Coalition was called to order by Dan Martin at 2:30 pm.

Approval of the July 25, 2012 Meeting Minutes

The Meeting Minutes for the July 25, 2012 meeting had previously been sent via email to Coalition Members for their review. Following a final opportunity to review the Minutes, Brenda Lutz made a motion to approve the minutes as presented, Erika Leader seconded the motion. After no further discussion, the motion carried and minutes were approved.

New Business:

Dan shared a document detailing some of the components of the National Safe Community America Designation Process application and site visit. The document was divided into two categories; Performance Indicators and Site Visit (what the assessors look for on-site). National Safe Communities America identifies four key competencies. Discussion about each followed:

Competency One: *Sustained Collaboration.* Dan shared his concern about loss of collaboration with only meeting quarterly. Dan discussed the timeline for International and National Safe Communities America Designation and his concern that we may not be as prepared with quarterly meetings. He then opened the floor to discussion about meeting frequency in anticipation and preparation for the application process for redesignation. Erika Leader shared that she didn't feel quarterly meetings were enough. Gary Cheney suggested to meet as a whole on a quarterly basis with task force and committee work on a monthly basis. Each member of the Coalition would be asked to serve minimally on one of the task forces/committees. The idea was that this would keep the group moving forward on our primary initiatives. Another suggestion was to return to monthly meetings as a whole in addition to the task force meetings in an effort

to keep the group accountable and to take advantage of more frequent updates. The idea behind this suggestion was that someone sitting on one committee may have valuable information or resources that would be beneficial to another committee, but may get overlooked with quarterly meetings. Following much discussion Dan felt the consensus was that the group wanted to revert back to monthly meetings beginning in January, 2013. The first meeting will take place on January 30th. Laruen Lotz suggested that everyone choose a task force to join and asked if a list of options could be provided. Dan will follow-up by sending out the task force list to all members.

One question under competency one asks if representatives seek information and resources from outside the community's borders. Dan asked that everyone on the coalition begin tracking this component for the next application process.

Competency Two: Community Data. In an effort to manage data ongoing, Lauren Lotz suggested a task force just to manage, compile and evaluate data for our programs and needs assessments. She offered to be involved with that effort.

Dan asked the group for suggestions as to who we may want to invite to the coalition, for contributions of data. Deb Hypke suggested a representative from Provena. Kathie Johnson suggested Pat Hensley from Senior Services. Lynn Bigelow confirmed that Pat is interested in joining.

Competency Three: *Programs.* Dan shared that he believes our greatest challenge meeting this competency falls in the question, "Were programs appropriately evaluated." Dan believes we need to focus more on evidence based programs that can be evaluated through outcome data. He explained as an example, the medication disposal program is not necessarily data driven nor is there hard evidence of the impact the program is having on the community.

Competency Four: *Evaluation.* While evidence based models from National Safe Communities assist in our efforts, Dan feels that we need to improve how we translate these down specifically to our community.

A complete copy of the document will be kept on file with the minutes.

Old Business:

Dan shared that the **Heroin Symposium** went very well with over 400 people in attendance. Many questions were asked of the presenters; indicating a true concern in the community.

ShareFest – Gary Cheney shared the following outcomes from ShareFest.

- 90,000+ pounds of hazardous waste have been collected over three years.
- 90,000+ pounds of electronics were collected over the past five years.
- 17,000 books donated over the past four years

- 103 different organizations have been involved in or impacted by ShareFest.
- 2012 Job Fair attendance was highest ever and a partnership developed with the Village, Library & Chamber to continue the efforts with the resume review sessions.

Gary went on to thank Dan Martin for all his efforts in leading many of the events and activities during ShareFest.

New Lenox CERT / MRC – Dan shared that CERT class #7 graduation took place on October 20th. Twenty-eight graduated, adding to a total of 221 to date. Eleven members participated in the Prairie State CERT Challenge on September 29th. New Lenox scored in the top three. Dan also shared the most current CERT newsletter which highlighted a myriad of events and activities CERT members volunteer to support throughout the community.

Safe Communities Website – <u>www.safenewlenox.org</u> Dan reminded everyone to please include a link on their website. Dan showed the website and talked about plans to grow the site and add more detailed program information.

Guest Speaker

Dan introduced guest speaker, Anastasia Tuskey with Will County HELPS (Heroin Education Leads to Preventative Solutions). Anastasia presented information about the concern and rising number of deaths in Will County as a result of heroin overdose. She explained that heroin use is a growing problem with the number of heroin related deaths in Will County on track to double that of 2011. In 2011 there were 24 total deaths. As of July, Will County has seen 30 deaths from heroin overdose. User ages range from 18-58. New Lenox Police Chief Sterba explained that heroin is the drug of choice for youth today; citing low price and ease of access. Will County HELPS has established four PSA's on their website www.willcountyillinois.com.

An educational forum is proposed for September 20th at Lincoln-Way Central High School. The forum would provide education and answers about resources. Speakers may include a representative from the Robert Crown Educational Program, a heroin addict and possibly a family member of someone who lost their life to heroin use. The program will address the legal, social and physical consequences of heroin use. Dan will work on finding speakers by the end of the week so promotion of the program can begin. Upon feedback that September 20th may conflict with other events previously scheduled, Dan will look at September 27th as an alternate date.

New Business

Personnel Changes

Dan shared the following changes: Mary Jo Button will take over for Marcy Anderson to represent St. Jude Parish. <u>New Membership</u>--Gary Cheney introduced Marta Keane of the Will County Land Use Waste Services Division. He spoke of her work to keep homes free of hazardous waste. After talking about her experiences, Gary moved to nominate her to become a member

of the New Lenox Safe Communities America Coalition. A second to the motion was offered by Lisa Kline.

With no further discussion, Marta's nomination was unanimously approved. Marta was welcomed to the Safe Communities America Coalition.

Old Business:

Safe New Lenox Website

Dan gave an overview of his work on creating a website. Dan showed the members the new website, <u>www.safenewlenox.org</u>. There are links to all the member organizations' websites. He asked if each organization could also have a link back to the Safe New Lenox site.

On the website visitors can find links to New Lenox Safe Communities America Coalition, Citizens Corps Council, Medical Reserve Corps, Community Emergency Response Team, newsletters, minutes from all groups, etc. Dan reminded all that this is still a work in progress and any suggestions are welcome. Upgrades to the site can be made after May 1 (the beginning of the new fiscal year).

New Lenox Safe Communities America Self-Assessment Survey

Dan said the self-assessment survey had a good response from members. It generated a 36-page report. We scored in the 4.0-4.5 zone. If members would like a copy of the report, let Dan know. He also asked members for ideas on how we can improve.

Suicide Prevention and Awareness Program

Dan said there is a new toolkit available from the CDC which we can obtain. With money from fundraisers last year, Suicide Prevention signs were purchased and placed throughout the Village. There was also money for starting the website and some for the Crisis Line of Will County.

Falls Prevention Program

In Lynn Bigelow's absence, Dan gave her report. Kathy, Erika, Lynn and Dan met and decided they would like us to link to a group in Omaha to see what more we can be doing besides just Tai Chi classes for our seniors. He hopes to have a report on this by the July meeting.

Kathy asked if Slips, Trips and Falls prevention class can be done in July.

National Heart Month

Participated in the Million Hearts Campaign in February; their goal is to prevent a million heart attacks by 2016.

Health and Safety Expo/Severe Weather Spotters Training

Brenda Lutz reported there were 304 people who attended the event on March 6th. She said Will County can do only 4 of the Weather Spotters classes each year. Since we

have done one for 3 years in a row, next year it will be in Lockport instead. After that, we can alternate years with other communities.

However, we can still have the Safety Expo and a preparedness class next year instead. Dan said he would like to use Lincoln Way West again. Deb Hypke asked if we could consider having it in conjunction with the Chamber's Community Expo. That is held at Lincoln Way Central and is always on a Saturday in mid-March.

Lisa Kline suggested a sub-committee look into this and then get back to NLSCAC and NLCCC if this will work for us. The question was raised as to whether there would be a good turnout? It was also mentioned that this might be a good time for a Slips, Trips and Falls presentation as a lot of seniors attend the Expo.

Women's Self Defense Class

Dan gave a report on the March 10th event. The class was 2 ½ hours and went very well. Another is set for June 9, 2012 and can take up to 30 people. The cost is \$10. It will be held from 9-11:30 am. Dan suggested CERT, MRC, NLSCAC, NLCCC members participate. If there is still room left after registering, the public can also participate. It is suggested for those 12 years and older.

National Donate Life Month

Gary Cheney reported Fishers of Men is having a Unity Breakfast this Saturday and they are promoting National organ Donation Month. Members from the Secretary of State's Office will be there to sign donors up. Dan mentioned that Will County is below the state average for having registered organ donors.

At the breakfast they will be honoring those who make a difference in the community.

Health Lecture Series on Arthritis

The lecture on Arthritis was done in conjunction with AthletiCo. There were 30 seniors in attendance for the lecture. They had some very good feedback and decided they will continue to present timely subjects in the lecture series.

New Lenox CERT and MRC Update

Dan Martin said all the dates from their recent events are listed on the agenda. He mentioned the CERT team raised \$3,000 for St. Baldrick's Day and the entire event made \$50,000.

They will participate again this year in a number of Runs: St. Jude's, District 122, Shamrock Shuffle, the Chamber of Commerce and the Chicago Marathon.

New Business:

Dan Martin announced Marcy Anderson will be leaving her position at St. Jude's the end of June to join her husband in retirement. Dan thanked Marcy for her participation on NLSCAC and NLCCC for the past 3+ years. On behalf of NLSCAC and NLCCC, Dan presented Marcy with a plaque in gratitude for her service.

Approval of the November 30, 2011 Meeting Minutes

The Meeting Minutes for the November 30, 2011 meeting had previously been sent via email to Coalition Members for their review. Following a final opportunity to review the Minutes, Deb Hypke made a motion to approve them while Lisa Kline provided a second to the motion. After no further discussion, the Minutes were unanimously approved.

Old Business:

Suicide Prevention and Awareness Program

Dan showed a copy of the Suicide Prevention signs that have been placed throughout the Village. There are 12 signs, all purchased through fundraising dollars. The only other communities in the Metro area that have these signs are Lombard and Villa Park.

Dan said we need to revitalize this committee to be able to present more suicide prevention options for the community. Dan and Michele will get together soon to work on this.

The new website is coming along but is not what Dan wants to see just yet. The website will be <u>www.safenewlenox.org</u> when launched. New Lenox Safe Communities America Coalition, Citizens Corps Council, MRC and CERT will all be included on the

site. Under the Safe Communities America tab will be all our programs and the same for under the Citizen Corps Council tab.

Falls Prevention Program

In Lynn's absence, Dan gave her report. We have to present two program evaluations by February 9 for the Safe Communities America Annual Report. Both have to be evaluated and make sense. We have to prove they are working. Question: Do we have pre and post survey questions to find out if the falls prevention program is working to prevent falls? If we have stats that show fewer injuries from falls are being reported, this will help prove that the program is working.

Kathie Johnson said some people are enjoying the Tai Chi classes so much that they are taking it several times. She has their phone numbers and addresses and could contact them for completing a survey.

It was discussed that Falls Prevention needs to be more than just Tai Chi classes. We need to branch out. Ideally we would like to present programs, safety videos, etc. to different senior groups in the community.

New Lenox CERT and MRC Update

- The semi-annual meeting is tomorrow. Dan spoke about several of the committees and showed everyone the newest CERT newsletter. The newsletters will be available on our website so other communities can see what we are doing.
- There will be a Pet Preparedness Presentation at the Stone City Kennel Club on Feb. 21st.
- CERT has been asked to participate in the Shamrock Shuffle on March 25th; it will be similar to what they did at the Chicago Marathon.
- Dan will be participating in the St. Baldrick's Fundraiser on March 23rd.

Health and Safety Expo / Severe Weather Spotter Training

The next class is scheduled for Tuesday, March 6, during Severe Weather Week. It will be held at Lincoln Way West High School.

The Safety Expo has had a time change; it will be an hour longer from 5-7 pm as there are a lot more groups participating this year. It may have to move to the school cafeteria for space. In the past we have had about 400 participants in the class, this year Dan would like to see 500-600 participate.

He is still looking for a meteorologist to open the Weather Spotters Class, but has had no luck so far. There was some discussion on the opening ceremonies at the beginning of the class. Dan asked all members to promote the class in their respective organizations.

Safe Communities America Annual Report

The Safe Communities annual report and self assessment is due by February 9th. We are to have a Teen Driving program done by then. We will use Lincoln Way West's "Operation Teen Safe Driving" documentation to send in for the report.

A complete re-evaluation of our Safe Communities program will need to be done again in 3 years (it has been 2 years since our original evaluation).

New Business:

Health and Safety Campaigns

Dan asked if we want to do some community events for some programs. Those discussed were National Heart Month (Feb.), The Great U.S. Shake Out (Feb. 7), and National Donate Life Month (April). Members looked through the handouts for these programs and there was some discussion.

John Mitchell gave members some information about the American Red Cross that not all people are aware of. Red Cross services are available to all; 97% of those with the Red Cross are volunteers; they recruit volunteers during American Red Cross Month in March; The Patient Connection Program works to get information from victims of a disaster and help reconnect them with family when communication has been cut off. The International Red Cross is responsible for visiting prisoners of war to be sure the rules of the Geneva Convention are being followed.

Do we want to sponsor a blood drive during March?

There was discussion on Organ Tissue Donation. Gary Cheney said there is a Men's Unity Breakfast each year and is scheduled for April 28th. They can ask attendees to sign an organ donor card at that time. He said that during ShareFest in September, there is an Eleven Days of Giving leading up to the ShareFest weekend; they could have an Organ Tissue Donor sign-up day as part of the event this year.

It was mentioned that Will County is currently only at 50%, compared to other areas of the state, when it comes to getting organ donors signed up.

Coalition members can each place orders for organ tissue brochures for our organizations.

Organization Updates

Dan Martin—announced there is a <u>surprise</u> welcome home for Scott Schaefer who is a CERT member and just returned home from active duty. The gathering will be here at Village Hall. All who are able, are asked to attend and bring others with. Be here at 6:30 pm, the surprise will take place at 7 pm as Scott thinks he is coming here for meeting at 7 pm.

Phil Pfeifer—has been working with groups in Orland Park on injury prevention. There have been several recent sports injuries among young athletes.

Lynn Bigelow—Dan gave her update. She will have some youth sports related lectures coming up in Spring/Summer of 2012.

Lisa Kline—the 3rd annual Lions Club Fashion Show will be held on March 25 at the VFW Hall at 1:30 pm.

Marcy Anderson—announced that there will be an Open House at St. Jude School on Sunday, January 29 from 10 am-2 pm. They will be taking registration for the 2012-2013 school year at that time. Please pass the word.

Erika Leader—there is also a Welcome Home celebration for Jordan Krimmel, a Marine who is returning home. It will be held at Liberty Junior High at 7:30 pm this Saturday. Fire Department members will be there and all are invited to help join in the welcoming!

She said there was a recent article in *The Patriot* about the Residential Lock Box Program. This is for those people with medical problems; a special lock box can be put on their front door with the key to their home in it. Only Fire Department personnel can get into the box in case of emergency. They know when they are dispatched that the house they are going to has a lock box on it.

Erika has tickets to the Fire Department's Fundraiser; proceeds go to the Fire Foundation. The Fire Department is also participating in the St. Baldrick's Day event. If they raise \$10,000, Chief Mead will shave off his beloved moustache!

Kathie Johnson—said the food pantry is very busy. She ordered \$3,000 worth of food from Aldi's which should last them about 4 weeks.

She reminded everyone that they operate an E-waste program at the Township office.

Kathy mentioned the Grand Opening of the new Goodwill Store. The Township will be partnering with them and the Salvation Army.

Gary Cheney—reminded everyone that a Hazardous Waste Collection costs \$10,000 to operate. He said if we could spread the word because we will need a number of organizations to help financially in order to put on another one.

Jackie Mansholt—has yellow dots for the Yellow Dot Program; we can call her to get them. If you put a yellow dot on your windshield, that tells emergency personnel that your medical information is in the glove compartment.

Deb Hypke—March 17th is the date for the Expo & Home Show. They have around 2,000 people attend this event each year, so it is a good way to get out the word about our organizations. There will be a health and wellness section to the Expo. They will try and have a blood drive at that time.

Don Sebestyen—said National Catholic Schools Week begins next week. This is celebrated at all Catholic elementary and high schools around the country with lots of extra activities in the schools.

Bob Nelson—mentioned the program Immerman's Angels which gives support to those with cancer. There are people that you can contact if you are facing cancer and cancer treatment.

Rob Schiffbauer—said there will be a St. Baldrick's event at the Lincoln Way West basketball game on February 3rd.

Alex Vancina—announced that the Café at the library has been closed temporarily due to illness of the owner. He does not know when it will reopen.

John Mitchell--said the Chicago Chapter of the Red Cross now encompasses 13 counties in Illinois and northern Indiana.

Tom Donegan—said he has some good news coming from Metra this time. He said the Federal Railroad Administration has put high speed rail on the back burner for the moment and is investing in safety on trains. Metra will be increasing the interior lighting, including strip lights on the floors, and extra removable windows. There are currently 375 coaches in the system which will need to be retrofitted with these changes. It may take 3-4 years to get all of this completed.

Approval of the October 26, 2011 Meeting Minutes

The Meeting Minutes for the October 26, 2011 meeting had previously been sent via email to Coalition Members for their review. Following a final opportunity to review the Minutes, Lauren Lotz made a motion to approve them while Erika Leader provided a second to the motion. After no further discussion, the Minutes were unanimously approved.

Old Business

Dan Martin gave a brief review of our 2011 events. He said that injury data drives what we do. It was decided to pick a couple of programs and to concentrate on them, which is what we did this past year.

Suicide Prevention and Awareness Program

Dan gave a current status of the program.

The Bowling Event in May was successful; the event at Tom Kelly's in November, although not quite so successful helped a little with some extra funds.

Suicide prevention signs will be purchased with some of the funds and will be placed on the Metra tracks in New Lenox. Each sign (there are 12) will have some logos (Safe Communities America, Operation Lifesaver and New Lenox Police Department) on

them along with the National Suicide Hotline phone number. Each sign measures 18 x 24 inches and will cost \$126 apiece.

Dan continues to work on the new website. It will have a link to the Suicide Prevention website. The new site will likely be <u>www.safenewlenox.org</u> and will have our mission on it. Dan will upload newsletters to the site and have a link to health and safety events in the community. The design of the site will run around \$500 plus the annual fee to have the domain.

Falls Prevention Program

Lynn Bigelow also gave a brief review of 2011. There were 53 people who attended the luncheon in May. From that, a Tai Chi class was organized. There have been several classes since then. Each class starts out fairly large but then dwindles to about 15 people who attend regularly.

A lecture was held in November on balance and Vertigo. There were 18 in attendance. In March or April of 2012 she would like to organize a medication seminar for seniors and possibly work with Silver Cross on this. She is also looking at an arthritis lecture in March.

New Lenox CERT and MRC Update

- The most recent CERT class graduated on Nov. 12. There are now 190 people in the community who have gone through CERT training.
- Dan would like to hold 2 classes in 2012; one in the spring and one in the fall

Severe Weather Spotters Training

The next class is scheduled for Tuesday March 6, 2012 during Severe Weather Week. It will be held at Lincoln Way West High School and a Health & Safety Expo will be held before the class from 6-7 pm. Dan asked for anyone interested in having a booth, to please get in touch with him right away to reserve a spot. He already has 5-6 new organizations interested in having a booth this year. The Weather Spotter's Class will follow the Expo from 7-9 pm.

Self-Assessment Tool

Dan reminded all that we were to take an online assessment of our programs to be sure there is sustainability in each. Since each program is the result of what we have discussed here, we need to be sure we are evaluating each program. Several members have taken the assessment but there are others he still needs to hear from.

Safe Communities Annual Report

The National Safety Council is requiring that we have a teen driving program and evaluation each year. We do not really have a program through NLSCAC but the high schools have a road to reality program. Dan indicated Allstate can bring a driving simulator and we could do a Teen Distracted Driving Presentation.

New Business

We have been meeting since January of 2009 on a monthly basis as we were organizing and getting ready for designation as a Safe Community. After nearly 3 years, it is possible we might be able to go to quarterly meetings.

Dan passed out a draft of possible dates on a quarterly basis for 2012. Discussion followed.

<u>Some ideas:</u> we need to be sure each meeting is long enough to discuss future events; we will need to look at what we want to accomplish and break down goals for that on a quarterly basis; the possibility of changing the proposed October 31 meeting to October 24 of 2012.

All members seemed pleased to change to the quarterly meetings option. A motion was made by Kate Hall to change to quarterly meetings for 2012, Erika Leader provided a second to the motion. After no further discussion, the motion was carried unanimously.

Dan Martin thanked all on the coalition for all the work they have done on behalf of the Village and Police Department.

Organization Updates

Lynn Bigelow—said AthletiCo celebrates its 20 anniversary next week; they are planning a big party to mark the milestone.

Lisa Kline—mentioned that the Lions Club Annual Blizzard Dinner/Dance was a big success. They are getting ready for Breakfast with Santa this Sunday.

Lauren Lotz—announced the Park District catalog for Winter/Spring 2012 is now out and they offer over 300 programs to residents. They are currently updating their website.

Erika Leader—said that Holiday Safety Tips are now being handed out.

Pam Davis—announced they received the keys to the new hospital on Nov. 1st. They will start doing orientation for new employees. The Illumination Gala will be on February 4 at the hospital. February 12 is the community Open House and February 6 is the Behavioral Health Unit Open House. All patients move into the hospital on February 26th.

Kate Hall—said she has been at the library now for a year. They are open again on Fridays from 10 am-6 pm. The coffee shop is also open again. They held a program called Food for Fines—money went to the food pantry and fines were forgiven. The Library Board is revising their mission statement to: "Inform, Enrich, Enlighten." The board is also working on strategic planning; they are going to be applying for more grants and increase their revenue sources, however, they do not intend to hold another referendum.

Phil Pfeifer—mentioned a lot going on in youth sports right now and also commented on the 20 year anniversary of AthletiCo.

Brenda Lutz—said they are busy with end of the year projects. She said IDOT is pushing the Yellow Dot Program. They had it in Will County for years. She said it is time to promote this to the special needs community. She said the Will County 911 Office has packets of info on this and they can be gotten from the police department too.

Michelle Batara—said she is busy working with families who have many needs this Christmas.

John Mitchell and Kevin Joyce—the Red Cross is consolidating offices nationwide and the Chicago office is part of the consolidation. Some smaller chapters are closing. Chicago will now be handling DeKalb, Grundy, (Lake, Newton and Jasper in Indiana) and Kankakee Counties in Illinois in addition to all their previous areas. All employees will have a lot of additional duties.

Kathie Johnson—gave a wrap-up of Thanksgiving program for families. They handed out 120 turkeys. Donations are now coming in for Christmas. She recently accepted a check for \$10,000 for the food pantry. The Food Drive the scouts held filled the pantry to overflow capacity!

Marcy Anderson—in addition to the Thanksgiving Basket program at St. Jude's (in conjunction with the VFW Auxiliary), she mentioned the Christmas Giving Tree program is under way. Lots of families are in need again this year. She gave a brief update on some recent safety programs held at St. Jude School

Tom Donegan—Metra is raising its rates by 25% and there is a lot of reorganizing going on.

He has received numerous calls recently from different people around the Chicago area that are observing kids running under, through and around trains in order to take shortcuts to school. He has been going to the principals of the schools to point out the dangers. He has taken photographs with him to demonstrate to the schools, kids and parents the dangers of doing this! Although there is not much trouble with this kind of behavior in the New Lenox area, he may contact the school principals here and talk to them.

Tom indicated that the time from Thanksgiving to New Year's there is a big increase in suicides on railroad tracks.

Mike Potocki—said he has taken on 5 new volunteers; this brings their numbers back up to where they had been.

Will County Recycling Presentation

Marta Keane, Recycling Specialist for Will County Land Use, handed out several pamphlets regarding various types of recycling offered in Will County.

She indicated there will be another Hazardous Waste Recycling day this Saturday from 8 am-3 pm at Hadley Middle School in Homer Glen. This will include pesticides and oil collection. They do not take latex paints as they are not considered hazardous. Ace Hardware will recycle them or we can harden them ourselves by putting kitty litter in them and set outside on a sunny day to harden and then place in the garbage.

A permanent facility for hazardous waste is located in Naperville every Saturday and Sunday. Check the Will County Recycling website at <u>www.willcountygreen.com</u> for information on this and all information presented by Marta today.

We can recycle CFL bulbs at the county or through Ace Hardware or Home Depot.

Will County now has a free Front Door Service recycling on electronics (the first in the nation). They will take up to 10 items at a time. This is at your front door, not at the

curb. Be sure to erase the memory on any computers, cell phones, printers, etc. before placing outside. Hard drives and other materials can be used again in creating other electronics. Information on this service is available on their website.

Will County has recycled over 1 million pounds in electronics in the past 2 years.

Marta mentioned the Green Business Program and some of the businesses participating. She mentioned there is a questionnaire that businesses can fill out on their website.

HEARTS Network Presentation

Charlene Slighting-Doud of the National Safety Council gave a PowerPoint presentation on the HEARTS (Honoring Everyone Affected, Rallying The Survivors) Network. The purpose of the HEARTS Network is to lower the rates of car crashes among teen drivers. It also serves as a voice for survivors of crashes and those suffering the loss of a family member from a crash involving teens.

They are working to change teens' behaviors behind the wheel. Charlene pointed out that passengers are a distraction for teen drivers. The more passengers in the car, the higher the risk of crashes. The rate is the highest among 16-17 year olds. After age 30,

the rate drops much lower. Talking on the phone is a huge distraction because they are concentrating on too many things at once.

HEARTS encourages graduated stages before teens can drive unrestricted. At all stages they encourage no cell phone usage and that all use seat belts.

Charlene is a member of the HEARTS Community, as she lost her father in a crash involving a teen driver. For more information, we can go to the National Safety Council site at <u>www.nsc.org</u>; email is: hearts@nsc.org. Her phone number is 630-775-2411.

The HEARTS Network is a program of the National Safety Council and was created with a grant from the Allstate Foundation.

Approval of the April 27, 2011 Meeting Minutes

The Meeting Minutes for the April 27, 2011 meeting had previously been sent via email to Coalition Members for their review. Following a final opportunity to review the Minutes, Lynn Bigelow made a motion to approve them while Lisa Smith provided a second to the motion. After no further discussion, the Minutes were unanimously approved.

Slips, Trips and Falls within the 65+ Population

Lynn Bigelow informed all that the senior lunch on May 18th had 50 people in attendance. There were folks from the press also in attendance.

At the first Tai Chi class yesterday, there were 25 people participating. Kathie Johnson attended the class and will continue to go each week in order to take attendance. She said the instructor, Wayne Jupiter, did a great job teaching the class. He went slow and answered participants questions. They can use this as a way to get participants to talk about slips, trips and fall.

Lauren Lotz will come to next week's class and take some photos and send to the press.

The class is every Tuesday from 1-2 pm and lasts 12 weeks. The cost for the entire 12 weeks is \$15. Lynn hopes that those who are happy with the course will spread the word. There is no special equipment needed to take Tai Chi.

Dan Martin said the bulk of the work on this is done but there will need to be some fine tuning along the way. We need to find a way to measure our success. The last data we

received on slips, trips and falls was from 2008. We need data from 2009-2011 in the 65+ population.

The data will come from zip code 60451 (this includes the Village and Township). This will keep the data consistent within the same area from which we took the data from 2008. We took data from the NLFPD and ER at Silver Cross Hospital. We will need to use both again to see if there are any significant changes. It may take up to 2 years to see if there are any changes.

It was suggested we ask the Tai Chi class if they have ever had a trip to the ER for a slip, trip or fall then ask them again periodically.

Suicide Prevention and Awareness Program

Michelle Batara thanked everyone for all their help with the Candlelight Bowling event on May 21. They made over \$4,500 for the evening. The Suicide Prevention and Awareness Committee will decide exactly how to use the money. They may use for pamphlets or creation of a website.

The event was a lot of work but the rewards were worth it. People had lots of fun. It was nice that people gave back all or part of their winnings from the 50/50 raffle. The Peer Helpers from Lincoln Way did a great job.

Dan remarked that thank you notes will be written in the next couple of weeks to those who donated towards the raffle items. He said the management of Laraway Lanes was very helpful; they did all they said they would do to make the evening go well.

There was a suggestion that if this is done again, check boxes be placed on the tickets indicating if people plan to attend or plan to donate if not attending. This might be helpful in knowing just how many people to plan for at the bowling alley.

New Lenox CERT and MRC Update

- May 1, they participated in the Loyalty Day Parade; they handed out literature as well as candy.
- May 21, 115 people participated in training: search, transport, triage, cribbing exercise, and team building. It was a great but intense 4 hour exercise held at the Frankfort Fire Station 3. Kathie thanked all those who have taken the CERT course, we never know when something terrible might happen and we will need these trained citizens.
- They have been asked to help out this year at the Triple Play Concert Series. They will also help at the Sean Kingston Concert at Lincoln Way Central in July.
- They are signed up for 3 Saturdays at the Farmer's Market this summer.
- There is a contingency that will help out at the Chicago Marathon in the fall.
- The latest newsletter for CERT/MRC is ready to go out.
- There are no training classes scheduled for this summer, they will resume in the fall. So far, 165 people have taken the CERT training.

Old Business

Lauren Lotz asked again if anyone is interested in working at Proud American Days. We can make money for our organizations doing this. She asked again if NLSCAC and NLCCC would like to participate. Since she has not heard from us since she last mentioned it, does this mean we do not want to participate?

Proud American Days is July 28-31. They are in need of help on Friday evening, the 29th, from 4- midnight, approximately 40 people are needed and again on Saturday, the 30th (various hours) about 40-45 people. The shifts are 31/2 to 4 hours long.

New Business

The annual Safe Communities America Networking Conference will be held August 3 & 4 in Itasca. Dan said there is so much information gleaned at this conference; it is hard to bring it all back. He encouraged as many of us a possible to attend.

Dan gave a synopsis of our first 18 months of existence as a coalition and how most of that was dedicated to achieving our designation as a Safe Community America.

This past year we have concentrated on the areas we knew needed to be addressed: Slips, Trips & Falls and Suicide Awareness and Prevention. Those two programs are underway and moving forward.

Dan wondered how we proceed as a coalition from here. Do we need to continue to meet each month or do we drop back to every other month or even quarterly and keep in touch through email in between time. Since attendance lately has been lagging, do we take the summer months off?

Dan would ideally like to invite speakers to attend our meetings but he needs to be sure that our members will be present for a speaker.

- Do we need to set goals for the entire group rather than just for the committees?
- Our meetings should be more about decision-making, not just listening to updates.
- Do we need to do some strategic planning? Small groups dedicated to looking ahead 12 months or more into the future.
- Do we need to change the time of the meetings to later in the day?
- We will occasionally need new organizations/members to join the coalition.

The decisions made:

- Current projects will continue to be worked on over the summer.
- Dan will contact coalition organizations over the summer to see what their commitment is to the group. If they want to continue, they will be asked to attend meetings or send a substitute.
- We will take the summer months off and meet again on August 31st.
- The August meeting may focus on strategic planning.

• Bring back ideas from Safe Communities Conference that can be of help to us moving forward.

Dan mentioned one of the items on the agenda at the conference will be "sustaining coalitions after designation." There are other groups who have faced the same challenges we are facing. This will be a good opportunity to find out how other groups move forward.

Slips, Trips and Falls within the 65+ Population

Lynn Bigelow indicated the Focus Group did not work out as expected. Therefore we will tentatively schedule a lunch for May 11th at 11:30 am. We will cap the RSVP's to this lunch at 40 people.

Wilma Hopkins from the Joliet Senior Services Center and Lynn will present Tai Chi and other options at this gathering to the seniors. Slips, Trips and Falls within the 65+ Population

Lynn Bigelow indicated we will partner with Senior Services Center of Will County for the Slips Trips and Falls program and for the Senior Breakfast being planned for March 30th at 8:00 am.

She said she has planned on calling the seniors program, "Seniors, Watch Your Step".

There was discussion on different types of strength and balance classes to offer seniors including Tai Chi, Yoga and Zumba.

There was also lengthy discussion on how many people to invite to the Seniors Breakfast and how best to advertise the breakfast which is being held to seek feedback from seniors on what kind of safety programs they would like to see created.

It was decided to offer just a light breakfast of: juice, coffee, fruit and bagels, etc. and to invite approx. 40-50 people.

Suicide Prevention and Awareness Program

Approval of the October 27, 2010 Meeting Minutes

The Meeting Minutes for the October 27, 2010 meeting had previously been sent via email to Coalition Members for their review. Following a final opportunity to review the Minutes, Lisa Kline made a motion to approve them while Lynn Bigelow provided a second to the motion. After no further discussion, the Minutes were unanimously approved.

Slips, Trips and Falls within the 65+ Population

Lynn Bigelow reported that she met with a Tai Chi instructor in Orland Park. The woman instructor originally said she would come to New Lenox to do a class for seniors for \$70-\$100 for a six-week program. In a subsequent conversation, she changed the price to \$70 per night per person. Lynn advised her that that was too high a price per person.

Discussion amongst NLSCAC members included the possibility of paying the instructor \$120 per session and dividing that cost among the class participants. It was decided whoever teaches the class needs to be a certified instructor.

Kathie Johnson indicated she has someone in mind who might teach the class; she will check with them.

Lynn will meet with the manager of Lowe's tomorrow to see what they can help with regarding safety supplies for homeowners.

Erika reported she and Chief Mead have been doing some research on falls, as they have had many emergency calls lately due to falls. They found that Stanford University

Medical Center has a program for people who come into the emergency room for fall injuries. They are looking into the program and have a copy of it; it seems like a good program.

Dan indicated the first 15 participants will go through a pilot program that includes:

- Education
- Hazard analysis
- Tai Chi
- Home inspection

Dan suggests we work with Silver Cross Hospital and give patients information about the Slips, Trips and Falls Program.

It was suggested we need to create a name for the program other than slips, trips and falls. Erika mentioned the name of Stanford's program is "Farewell to Falls."

Lynn requested help on this committee. Erika will continue to work on it and Kathie Johnson said she would help with calls, etc.

Suicide Prevention and Awareness Program

The Suicide Prevention and Awareness Committee met this morning. It was suggested that Lorrie Perry from the local (Will County) chapter of the National Alliance for the Mentally III be involved with the committee.

They talked about creating a website and looked towards Batavia's site as an example as it's well organized and very comprehensive. Dan will ask one of the New Lenox CERT members who specializes in web sites to assist with this project.

They discussed educating fire, police and first responders, but concentrate on educating the public first. We need to key into all ways that we can promote this to the public. October is National Suicide Prevention Month and May is Mental Health Awareness Month.

There are support groups for those who have tried to commit suicide as well as family members of those who have committed suicide or attempted suicide.

Suicide can be seasonal (Seasonal Affective Disorder--SAD), situational (divorce, loss of job, loss of family member, etc.) or a mental health issue. The month of April has the highest number of suicides.

Don Sebestyen spoke about the SPECTRUM program at Providence H.S. When they become aware that a student is going through a death in the family or divorce in the family they get the student to see a counselor. When a student's grades fall or behavior changes or the school becomes aware of problems, they go into the program where kids mentor other kids about their problems. They feel this works better that having an adult lecture to them.

Dan Martin asked anyone with additional ideas or suggestions regarding the Suicide Prevention and Awareness Program to please contact him or Michele; the committee will be meeting again in January, 2011.

New Lenox CERT Update

Dan Martin advised that CERT graduated another 26 participants on October 30th.

Fifty CERT members recently participated in a Shelter Management exercise at Lincoln Way Central High School. They went through the process of setting up a temporary shelter in the school gym. Dan reported the exercise went very well.

The Citizen Corps Council Grant for 2011 has been applied for. 100% of the 2010 CCC Grant of \$7500 has been spent.

New Lenox Medical Reserve Corps Update

After no further discussion, the Minutes were unanimously approved.

Slips, Trips and Falls within the 65+ Population

Lynn Bigelow reported that she has contacted a yoga group in Orland Park to teach Tai Chi classes. The question remains where to hold them and who will pay any associated costs?

There was some discussion that perhaps Lowe's might donate items (such as handlebars to help people get in and out of tubs, showers etc.). There was also discussion on getting the NLFPD to help by doing in-home checks to be sure they are safe from hazards.

Dan reported there may be a challenge with funding for items, etc. to cover the cost of the programs.

Gary Cheney said he has discussed this with several men's groups in the community to see if they can help with purchasing items.

The question was raised, do we need to do some fundraising to cover the costs of programs?

Suicide Awareness and Prevention Program

Jackie Mansholt reported on the Oct. 17th meeting of this committee.

They discussed:

- Training of first responders
- Possibly do a suicide prevention walk to bring attention to the problem
- Promotional material
- Discussed what is currently being done in the area

Dan has asked some representatives from Helping Hands McHenry County attend the next committee meeting. He also mentioned the website in Batavia as being a good resource for suicide prevention and awareness.

The next Suicide Prevention and Awareness Committee Meeting is Wednesday morning, November 17th.

American Red Cross Ready Rating Program

For those who were unable to attend the webinar on this program, Terri Rees gave some information to the members. There are two programs, one for schools and one for businesses. They will go into both and do a rating and analysis of how well prepared they are for disasters. This is a free service. They ask that those participating work to improve by a minimum of 1% over the course of the next year. This is a national program that is currently being used by the Pentagon.

They also offer assistance to help schools/businesses bring their scores up.

There was discussion as to whether we should look to see if there are other programs offered before deciding on this or to see if this is a program we could create for ourselves.

Terry is in structure and development –the safety side of the Red Cross. She mentioned they have nowhere in this area to hold the regular programs that they offer. They offer CPR; Babysitting Classes (\$85) for 11-15 year olds. (They will be certified after they complete the program; there is also a 2-day class for \$150); a Pet First Aid class (4 hours for \$60), and a Slips, Trips & Falls seminar.

The NLFD is planning to start a babysitting class that is going to run \$25. They offer American Heart Association CPR courses; it was asked if we could do a pet first-aid class but make it cheaper.

Dan, Erika and Terri will continue to discuss what classes may work best for New Lenox residents.

New Lenox CERT Update

At the October 20th General Meeting, there were 80 people in attendance. They may need to find another location to meet, perhaps Lincoln-Way West, to accommodate the growing number of team members.

When class #4 graduates on October 30th, there will be a total of 140 people who have completed the CERT course.

There is still difficulty in getting people to sign up to be placed in the special needs database. It was mentioned the term "special needs" is now changing to "functional needs."

New Lenox Medical Reserve Corps Update

Dan Martin has applied for a \$5,000 Capacity Building Grant. He informed us that all members of CERT are also members of MRC; the two programs complement each other.

The Chamber of Commerce Run on November 6th will have two aid stands that will be staffed by CERT/MRC members.

It was pointed out that non-medical people can be members of MRC. CERT/MRC members are well-distributed area throughout New Lenox.

The website needs to be updated with all the new information.

Old Business

Dan Martin reminded all that the Health and Safety Expo is scheduled for March 1, 2011 at Lincoln Way Central High School. Dan advised that Jim Alsopp will do the Severe Weather Spotter's Class.

Approval of the August 25, 2010 Meeting Minutes

The Meeting Minutes for the August 25, 2010 meeting had previously been sent via email to Coalition Members for their review. Following a final opportunity to review the Minutes, Lisa Kline made a motion to approve them while Kathie Johnson provided a second to the motion. After no further discussion, the Minutes were unanimously approved.

Slips, Trips and Falls within the 65+ Population

Lynn Bigelow was not able to attend the meeting due to illness. As such, Dan Martin provided a summary of a meeting that was held on September 20, 2010 between Lynn and Dan at AthletiCo in New Lenox.

Following a review of existing programs, it appears that a multi-disciplinary approach has proven to have the most success. The following areas were discussed:

- Host a meeting for "seniors" to provide information about the program.
 - o Luncheon-style for approximately 30-40 seniors
 - o Advertise / promote
 - Newspapers
 - Village web site
 - Channel 6 Cable TV
 - Village Newsletter
 - Community Alert / Notification System
 - Public Education
 - Home visit to check for hazards

- Perhaps request Lowes Home Improvement Center to donate / install handrails in tub / shower areas
- Balance and strength/conditioning
 - Tai Chi seems to be the most popular program

Of course, additional discussion needs to be had prior to the informational meeting. The NLSCAC needs to determine which of our organizations would be able to provide some of the above services related to the program. For example, who would conduct the home hazard inspections? Who would teach Tai Chi? These are issues that the committee will continue to work on and bring back to the group for additional discussion.

Following the meeting on September 20th, Lynn determined that the closest Tai Chi Instructor is in the Oak Forest / Orland Park area. Lynn advised that she needs to speak with the instructor to gain additional insight into the discipline and how it can help our targeted population.

Lynn also advised that she contacted Chief Mead at the NLFPD regarding the home safety inspections and he was open to the concept.

Lynn also advised that she would check with Lowes Home Improvement Center to determine if they would be willing to participate in the program by way of donation and installation of handrails (tub and shower) in the homes of those in need of such equipment.

Following the synopsis of the work that Lynn has accomplished thus far, Chris Weber advised that the NLFPD does conduct similar home inspections as previously discussed. Chris advised that he believed that the NLFPD would be able to assist with such a program. Dan Martin added that home inspection check lists do exist as they are utilized in programs sponsored by other designated Safe Communities.

Lauren Lotz advised that the New Lenox Community Park District would have a difficult time with the Tai Chi classes as they don't "own" any suitable facilities. In addition, Lauren advised that the Park District does have an exercise class designed for seniors but they've found that the seniors typically don't care for change. Kathie Johnson agreed and noted that she has also found that to be the case with her TRIAD work. Dan Martin suggested that we start from scratch with those that are interested in the program that would make suitable candidates.

A discussion was also held regarding funding for the program. The discussion included the suggestion that we apply for funding through grants. During the discussion it was noted that we might have a good chance based on the number of organizations that we have participating in the NLSCAC. Conversely, the demographics in New Lenox are such that funding through grants might be difficult.

Dan Martin advised that he will continue to work with Lynn on this program and additional information will be available at the **October 27, 2010** meeting.

Suicide and Attempt Suicide

Jackie Mansholt was not in attendance as she was currently attending the CERT Trainthe-Trainer Class in Springfield, IL. As such, Dan Martin provided a summary of a meeting that was held on September 15, 2010 at the Will County Health Department. Michele Batara / Executive Director of Crisis Line (of Will County), Jackie and Dan attended the meeting.

During the meeting, Michele was kind enough to explain her role as Executive Director of Crisis Line along with the services that are available. Crisis Line is staffed by a small number of staff members and approximately 25 volunteers who answer the phones 24 / 7. Crisis Line provides information and referrals during times when individuals are facing difficult times. Not only does their staff provide suicide counseling and referrals but they also provide counseling / referrals for those in need of assistance with food, shelter, clothing and other services.

Crisis Line is accredited through the American Association of Suicidology for the intervention and prevention of suicide. Their professionals undergo extensive training in the areas of normal and abnormal psychology, suicide prevention and emergency procedures, sex and family problems, drug and alcohol abuse, the structure of the community services and the techniques of non-directive counseling. This training is provided by local health professionals.

During the meeting, the discussion included what comprehensive suicide prevention program should include and it was clear that an organization such as Crisis Line would play an integral role. In addition, such a program should include an educational component that would cover awareness – signs & symptoms.

In addition, we discussed what organizations would play a key role in the development of a comprehensive program. Thus far, the recommendations are as follows:

- Will County Health Department
- Crisis Line
- Silver Cross Hospital
- Local Churches
- Local Schools

Jackie will handle contacting someone at Silver Cross Hospital as well as someone from the Health Department's Behavioral Health Unit to participate in the committee.

Subsequent to the meeting with Jackie and Michele, Dan advised that he contacted Mark Cohen from Lincoln Way School District #210 who will ask that someone participate in the committee. In addition, Dan contacted Pastor Hedlin from Peace

Lutheran Church who advised that Mary DeGroot (CERT volunteer) would like represent the faith-based community in this effort.

Prior to the discussion, Dan introduced Michele Batara who was kind enough to attend the meeting. Michele also provided an overview of the Crisis Line of Will County along with a brief history and facts pertaining to suicide. A number of questions were asked and answered during the discussion. Michele provided those in attendance with Will County Crisis Line brochures and business cards.

Following the discussion, Dan advised that the committee will be meeting again on October 13th at the Will County Health Department. Additional information regarding this initiative will be available at the **October 27, 2010** meeting.

New Lenox CERT Update

Dan Martin advised that the CERT held an exercise on Saturday September 18, 2010 at Oster-Oakview School. The exercise included a tornado event with 25 Lincoln Way Central High School students as "victims." The students received various types of injuries by way of moulage. The team determined who would be the Incident Commander and then developed Search and Rescue Teams, Transport Teams and a Triage area. Following the exercise a de-briefing was held in the cafeteria along with lunch which was donated by C P Meat Market and Berkot's. The exercise was evaluated by individuals from the Will County Health Department and the Will County Emergency Management Agency. Overall the exercise went very well and was a great learning experience for the team.

CERT Class #4, with 27 students is in full swing. The class started on September 16th and is scheduled to graduate on October 30th.

CERT's Committees are working hard and are doing some positive things for the community. There will be a meeting on October 13th with the leadership within the team followed by a general meeting with all team members on October 20th.

New Lenox Medical Reserve Corps Update

Dan Martin advised that the New Lenox Medical Reserve Corps has formally been approved and integration into the CERT is in progress. Dan will be attending a MRC video conference in Palatine, IL on October 8th to learn more about MRCs.

Old Business

2011 Health and Safety Expo

Dan Martin advised that the Health and Safety Expo is scheduled for March 1, 2011 at Lincoln Way Central High School. Dan advised that thus far only AthletiCo and the Will County Health Department have responded that they will participate. During the meeting the following organizations indicated that they will participate as well:

Approval of the July 28, 2010 Meeting Minutes

The Meeting Minutes for the July 28, 2010 meeting had previously been sent via email to Coalition Members for their review. Following a final opportunity to review the Minutes, Michael Potocki made a motion to approve them while Deb Hypke provided a second to the motion. After no further discussion, the Minutes were unanimously approved.

Injury Data Collection and Analysis

Brandt Fick, Administrative Director of Emergency Services was in attendance to provide the NLSCAC with a Power Point presentation on New Lenox Emergency Room Visits at Silver Cross Hospital. The presentation included, but was not limited to the following: National statistics (ER visits), New Lenox statistics, seasonal trends, demographics (age distribution ER visits), demographics (age distribution Admissions), demographics (gender / age breakout), demographics (race), mode of arrival, disposition of ER visits, admissions, reasons for ER visits (diagnosis), initial complaint of pain and NLSCAC high risk prevention opportunities.

During the presentation Brandt explained each of the slides and provided an opportunity for coalition members to ask questions. The presentation was well received and verified

that our coalition was heading in the right direction with regard to our injury prevention programs and activities.

Slips, Trips and Falls within the 65+ Population

Lynn Bigelow, who joined the meeting via conference call, advised that she did not have anything to add at this time regarding the Slips, Trips and Falls initiative.

Dan Martin advised that he and Lauren Lotz recently attended the 1st Annual Safe Communities America Conference in Elk Grove Village, IL on August 12th and 13th. During the conference there were at least two presentations by members of Safe Communities America Coalitions that addressed this issue. During the presentations discussion was had regarding best practice programs to include programs that encompass Tai Chi, home hazard analysis and public education. Dan and Lauren were able to exchange contact information with the presenters and will share the information with Lynn Bigelow and others that will be working on this initiative. Donna Stein-Harris from the National Safety Council advised that she would make copies (CDs) of the Power Point presentations and will send them out to conference attendees.

Additional work will completed regarding this initiative, followed by an update at the September 29, 2010 meeting.

Suicide and Attempted Suicide

Jackie Mansholt advised that she has started preliminary research into suicide prevention and what programs are available in Will County. Jackie advised that she will schedule a meeting in September with doctors and staff from the Will County Health Department who deal with mental health issues. In addition, Dan Martin reiterated that the CD from the Safe Communities Conference should contain at least one program dealing with suicide prevention. Contacts were also made with individuals from other communities that have these types of programs in place.

Additional work will completed regarding this initiative, followed by an update at the September 29, 2010 meeting.

September – National Preparedness Month

Dan Martin reminded all in attendance that September is National Preparedness Month. The Village of New Lenox, for example, will be conducting a preparedness payroll stuffer campaign in addition to placing information on the village web site.

Dan Martin advised coalition members that there will be a National Preparedness Month kick-off webinar on Tuesday August 31, 2010 at 12:00pm CST. The link to the web site was previously sent out to coalition members via email.

Another activity that coalition members can participate in is the preparedness "widget" attached in the signature line in e-mail. Brenda Lutz had previously forwarded the link to obtain the widget and on Brenda's behalf, Dan encouraged coalition members to use the widget during the month of September.

Additional information regarding National Preparedness Month can be found at the National Citizen Corps web site, the Ad Council's web site and at Ready.gov.

New Lenox CERT Update

Dan Martin advised that CERT Class #4 will be starting on September 16th. Enrollment in this class will be 20 plus 2 from Frankfort Gateway CERT sponsored by Will County EMA.

Team members from the Prairie State CERT Challenge will accept an award at the IEMA Conference on September 8th for their 2nd place finish in the Challenge.

New Lenox Medical Reserve Corps

Dan Martin advised that the online application for the New Lenox MRC had been completed as well as a 1 1/2hr. conference call with an MRC Regional Coordinator. New Lenox has recently been approved as an MRC and is now eligible to apply for the MRC Capacity Building Award (\$5000.00). Dan explained that there is much more to do and cited examples such as setting goals and objectives for the MRC, training, planning for events and setting the organizational structure.

Old Business

The American Red Cross Ready Rating Program was discussed including the recent changes in ARC personnel assigned to oversee the program. John Mitchell advised he would assist by making the appropriate phone calls to determine who is currently in charge of the program. Once determined, several coalition members expressed an interest in participating in a webinar to learn more about the program. Following the webinar a determination will be made regarding which organizations wish to proceed with the program.

Dan Martin provided coalition members with a summary of the Safe Communities America Conference and indicated that it was interesting and informative.

New Business

Dan Martin also advised that he had just received a phone call from a representative from FEMA, calling from Washington DC. The call was regarding a National Citizen Corps Council Achievement Award for the New Lenox Citizen Corps Council. Two representatives from the New Lenox Council will be allowed to attend a ceremony in Washington DC on September 22nd and 23rd to receive the award. Following discussion regarding who should attend on behalf of the New Lenox Citizen Corps Council, it was decided that Brenda Lutz and Dan Martin should attend. Additional information regarding the award will be available at the next meeting.

Gary Cheney provided coalition members with information regarding ShareFest 2010 which will take place on September 11, 2010. Gary provided an overview of each of the activities, explained the 9-11 Day of Remembrance Ceremony and provided handout material regarding the event.

Jon Mead advised that the New Lenox Fire Protection District is planning a communitywide fire drill for October 10th. In addition, the FPD will be hosting an open house on October 9th and will also be starting a program whereby businesses and homeowners can earn a Fire Protection Inspection Certificate if they participate in an inspection.

Approval of the June 30, 2010 Meeting Minutes

The Meeting Minutes for the June 30, 2010 meeting had previously been sent via email to Coalition Members for their review. Following a final opportunity to review the Minutes, Brenda Lutz made a motion to approve them. Lisa Kline provided a second to the motion. After no further discussion, the Minutes were unanimously approved.

Adding Additional NLSCAC Members to the New Lenox Citizen Corps Council

A discussion was held regarding the feasibility of adding the remaining members of the NLSCAC to the New Lenox Citizen Corps Council. Brenda Lutz advised that she did not find any conflicts with the New Lenox Citizen Corps Council By-Laws that would prohibit the additional members from joining. Lauren Lotz advised that she did not find any conflicts with the New Lenox Safe Communities America By-Laws either.

A motion to add the additional members of the New Lenox Safe Communities America Coalition to the New Lenox Citizen Corps Council was made by Brenda Lutz. A second was provided by Lisa Kline. Following no further discussion the motion was approved unanimously.

*There were not enough members of the New Lenox Citizen Corps Council (NLCCC) to hold a meeting and vote on this item. This will be placed on the Agenda for the August 25, 2010 NLCCC Meeting as a request for approval.

Injury Data

The agenda was to include an update by Jon Mead and Chris Weber from the New Lenox Fire Protection District regarding injury data collection and a status report on the collection of 2009 and 2010 data. This update was not made because no representatives from the New Lenox Fire Protection District were in attendance. The group agreed that the collection of injury data and interpretation is imperative in order for the coalition to move forward with the identification and development of needed safety programs.

In attendance, however, was Brandt Fick, the Administrative Director of Emergency Services for Silver Cross Hospital. Mr. Fick explained that Silver Cross does desire in participating with the New Lenox Safe Communities America Coalition and will name a replacement for David Maurer in the near future. Mr. Fick outlined the Silver Cross resources that are available for review and analysis of injury data. Specifically, the availability of Silver Cross' Emergency Room Data System, wherein information can be manipulated using various factors, including Zip Code, Gender, Age, Walk-In, Ambulance, etc. Mr. Fick agreed to bring to the next meeting a sampling of injury data for the group to review and discuss. In addition, further information could be compiled based on Tracy Simon's use of this system to examine market share as it relates to Silver Cross Hospital and the patients they serve as well as an ER Use Rates.

After discussion, Dan Martin again emphasized the importance of injury data collection and analysis as it provides guidelines and direction for the NLSCAC's work. Dan Martin will continue to stay in contact with the New Lenox Fire Protection District and Brandt Fick to ensure the appropriate data is captured.

Slips, Trips and Falls within the 65+ Population

Dan Martin advised that there are programs that address the issue of slips, trips and falls in the 65+ population which include education, exercise and a home hazard analysis.

Lynn Bigelow provided information on a Lowe's Home Improvement and Habitat for Humanity initiative where grant money is provided to provide safety upgrades to senior homes. This program also combines issues relating to fire prevention as well. The program was implemented in Hagerstown, Maryland. Based on information from a Safe Communities America Representative from Hagerstown, they did face challenges. Lynn Bigelow will obtain further details and elaborate further on this program at the next meeting. Hagerstown, Maryland did provide a copy of the grant application that was shared with Dan Martin and Lynn Bigelow.

Brandt Fick from Silver Cross Hospital indicated that he would generate statistics on this issue using Emergency Room statistical data with Audrey, a member of Silver Cross' Systems Department, based on previous information Dave Maurer was using.

Suicide and Attempted Suicide

Although not in attendance, Jackie Mansholt will continue to take the lead on the identification of programs designed for the growing trend of Suicides and Attempted Suicides with Dan Martin remaining a liaison for this safety initiative. Further information will be presented at the August 25, 2010 meeting.

Dan Martin has reviewed statistics regarding suicides and attempted suicides and the increasing numbers demonstrate the need for this safety initiative to remain a priority. He does, however, still need to acquire the New Lenox Fire Protection District's statistics on this issue. In addition, he presented some contributing factors that may be influencing the surge of suicides and attempts; namely the current economic conditions as well as job loss. Kathie Johnson also commented that the incidence of child abuse is also rising at an alarming rate. Dan Martin suggested that he, Jackie Mansholt, and Brenda Lutz, plan to meet with the mental health officials at the Will County Health Department to further identify programs and strategies that are currently available in Will County to determine if these programs can benefit the residents of New Lenox.

September – National Preparedness Month

National Preparedness Month is a national campaign which promoted through the Department of Homeland Security, FEMA, Ready.Gov and other organizations. Brenda Lutz provided a brief overview of National Preparedness Month and indicated that Will County has participated for the past six years.

Will County Citizen Corps Council activities to recognize September as National Preparedness Month will include pet preparedness planning along with a new pet preparedness planner, a Will County indoor warning system and promotion of the Special Needs Registry. Brenda Lutz will email all materials she has regarding the initiative that Will County CCC will be implementing. Further, Brenda Lutz encouraged all member groups to implement at least one program or small campaign in order to further promote September as National Preparedness Month. One simple suggestion was to have preparedness materials placed in employee's paychecks to promote National Preparedness month. Finally, Brenda Lutz encouraged all members to visit <u>www.ready.gov</u> to take advantage of the many tools provided for the promotion and implementation of September as National Preparedness Month.

New Lenox CERT Update (Dan Martin)

At the most recent CERT meeting held on July 20, 2010, Dan Martin reported that 67 CERT members were in attendance. There were some changes in leadership based on CERT members having to step down due to other commitments. Dan Martin appreciated the fact that other members did step up and he was looking forward to working the new Team Leaders and Assistant Team Leaders.

CERT Class #4 will begin on September 16th and run thru October 30th. Two students sponsored by Will County EMA / Frankfort Gateway CERT will be in the class along with 20 from New Lenox CERT.

A discussion was also held regarding the establishment of a Medical Reserve Corps (MRC). Information regarding the MRC was received earlier in the day by Dan Martin and the deadline to apply (to receive a monetary award) was Friday July 30, 2010. Cindy Jackson from the Will County Health Department brought the concept to Dan Martin's attention. If approved, a \$10,000 <u>award</u> is available with the feasibility of receiving a \$5,000 <u>grant</u> each year thereafter.

Dan Martin felt that the formation of a Medical Reserve Corps would greatly compliment the CERT program and is consistent with the mission of both the NLSCAC as well as the NLCCC. Dan Martin would oversee the Medical Reserve Corps in conjunction with CERT.

Members in attendance agreed that the formation of a Medical Reserve Corps was merited and that an application should be filed.

American Red Cross Ready Rating Program

Deb Hypke presented an update on the presentation of the Red Cross Ready Rating Program to be conducted on at the Chamber's August Meeting. Martin Makowski, of the American Red Cross, will be doing the presentation and Deb Hypke was informed that it will be a more in-depth presentation than the PowerPoint previously done. This presentation at the membership meeting will be used to gauge the level of interest by the New Lenox business community and other members of the chamber.

Safe Communities America Conference

Dan Martin again reiterated that the upcoming Safe Communities America Conference in Elk Grove Village on August 12th and 13th will be a great educational and networking opportunity.
